LCC Humanities expecting 35 graduates

The Luna Community College Humanities Department is expecting 35 graduates this fall, according to Director Shirley Marlow. As of the last count on Thursday afternoon, humanities had 35 petitions for graduation. They had eight in liberal arts, seven in human performances, two in mass media communications, three in general education certificates and 15 in criminal justice.

“Graduates should be very proud of their efforts, diligence and hard work,” said Marlow. “It is hoped that these potential students will bring with them a spirit of love for the subject and the motivation to learn as much as possible; sharing the learned information effectively with others.”

Marlow said that the majority of the students will transfer to four-year institutions. Although, some of them will be going directly to the work force.

The LCC Humanities Department consists of the following areas: Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts, Mass Media Communications, Criminal Justice, and Sports Performance. Certificate degrees include General Education and Criminal Justice.
