Martinez, Varela take first at state SkillsUSA competition

Garcia, Gomez, Ulibarri, Wu take second; Roxanne Garcia wins third; Gamertsfelder elected as state officer

Luna Community College students Crystal Rae Martinez and Earl Varela brought home gold medals from the state SkillsUSA competition held in Albuquerque over the weekend.

Martinez, a senior cosmetology student from Las Vegas, wowed the judges depicting the cast of the heavy rock group KISS on the nails of her model Victoria Perea. Martinez competed in nail care.

“It was a long, tough road but it was worth the work,” said Martinez. “I learned you can do anything if you put your mind to it.”

Earl Varela, a senior from Las Vegas was the other LCC student to take first place honors. Varela earned a gold medal in the collision repair category.

“It was a good experience,” said Varela. “There was a lot of hard work and dedication, but it pays off in the end.”

LCC had four second place finishers. Marcia Garcia took second in nail care. She painted Sesame Street characters on her model Antoinette Baca. Also taking second place were Lawrence Gomez, Kenneth Ulibarri and Anne Wu. Gomez competed in collision repair, Ulibarri in extemporaneous speaking and Wu in culinary arts.

Roxanne Garcia finished third in cosmetology. Gary Gamertsfelder will represent New Mexico as a state officer.

Martinez and Varela will compete at the SkillsUSA national competition in Kansas City in June.

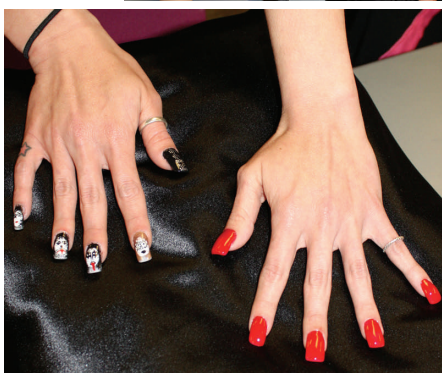

LCC celebrates Arbor Month

Gov. Susana Martinez has proclaimed March as Arbor Month. This means that Arbor Day celebrations can be held any day within the month of April. The Luna Community College Tree Board has taken the next step to becoming a Tree Campus U.S.A. along with Richard M. Flores, an intern through BCS/ACE here at Luna Community College.

Flores is interning at N.M. State Forestry based out of Storrie Lake and is working on the Tree Campus U.S.A program. It entails an inventory of all trees on campus, a tree maintenance program, formation of LCC Tree Board, community outreach activities, and finally the Arbor Day Observance.

LCC held its Arbor Day Celebration March 2. The New Mexico State Forestry donated two trees from the Tierra Y Montes Plantation near Storrie Lake. The LCC Tree Board decided to plant the two trees in observance of Arbor Day. One is a Blue Spruce and is planted in front of the Nursing Building. The other is a Ponderosa Pine replacing a dead Ponderosa Pine in front of the Technologies Building. This is the beginning of the new trees that will be placed on campus and our satellites.

During the last 60-day legislative session representatives from the City of Santa Rosa led by Mayor Albert Campos, Jr. met with Economic Development Secretary Designate Jon Barela and New Mexico Game and Fish Department Officials to discuss economic, fisheries and related educational opportunities for the people of Santa Rosa.

The results from that seed meeting have been phenomenal! Mayor Campos, who is also the longtime Luna Community College Director for our Santa Rosa satellite said: "When we work together to develop and promote our natural abilities and resources we'll amaze ourselves and others at what we can accomplish."

Then, a follow-up meeting was held in Santa Rosa to discuss possibilities for the clean use of the environment and water and how the community's population would benefit from a strategic plan that would effectively use the available resources like fresh water, ponds and lakes, good climate and a hard working labor force. The results of that meeting were exciting! Community leaders and members and USDA, Economic Development, Game and Fish and Aquatic Consultants, Inc. spoke persons shared their thoughts, ideas, how they could help and what destiny is ahead for Santa Rosa if residents pull together.

According to those at the meeting: there are numerous lakes and a large water source available to conduct various aspects of natural resources research; enact a feasibility study; review and improve fish production methods; and, implement product marketing and community branding to become the fish production community of the southwest.

I can imagine Santa Rosa becoming a research, educational, teaching and learning center for fisheries and water and environmental quality development; fish marketing and distribution; fish food and other by-product production; and, a whole community participating in an economic purpose that will keep people at home to learn a trade, earn income from their knowledge and experience and enjoy the satisfaction of being technically trained, sharing expertise with the world and producing fish for lakes and streams, fishing competitions and most importantly, to eat and live healthy.

I am especially appreciative that Luna Community College representatives are at the forefront of the educational strategy and course offerings to support this huge economic endeavor. This community example where people can work together, tap their natural strengths and *move ahead with one direction* is evidence that rural New Mexico communities can thrive even during tough global times.

Let us remember the environment those who came before us lived in; they often lived without today's technologies, were good neighbors, shared the scrumptious goodies prepared in their kitchens and cared for the neighborhood children as if they were their own. *Thank you Santa Rosa – Luna Community College stands ready to be a working partner!*
