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## Garcia takes the gold

In her own words, Luna Community College Dental Assisting student Monica Garcia said she was "shocked and nervous" when she heard her name called after winning the gold medal at Saturday's New Mexico SkillsUSA closing ceremony at the Crown Plaza.

"I love the dental assisting program," said Garcia minutes after receiving her gold medal. "I had been out of school for five years and the experience has been great. I was well prepared. I'm looking forward to competing at the national level."

Garcia will be the lone Luna Community College student to travel to the SkillsUSA Nationals in Kansas City. The competition will be held in June.

It was a clean sweep for Luna Community College in the dental assisting category. Joining Garcia on stage to receive medals were Devinn Martinez who won the silver medal. Maria Chavez took the bronze medal.

Two Luna Community College cosmetology students took second and third-place. It was the best showing in this category over the last few years. Amanda Silva brought home the silver medal with Danielle Carpenter winning the bronze medal.

"I'm still shocked over it; it hasn't sunk in," said Silva. "I wasn't expecting it."

Silva thinks it was her updo hairstyle that earned her the silver.

"I practiced it every day for the last month and the judges said it was

# April is an important month

This month is proving to be filled with conferences that will benefit Luna Community College in the long-run. First, Dr. Vidal Martinez and I are attending the 2013 North Central Association (NCA) Higher Learning Commission (HLC) Annual Conference (April 5-9) in Chicago. This conference focuses on two of the commission's projects which are in early implementation. They are: the Open and Standard Pathways for Reaffirmation of Accreditation and the revised Criteria for Accreditation. We will also hear from two keynote speakers: Dr. Elsa M. Núñez, President of Eastern Connecticut State University (recently ranked number 1 in retention of Hispanic students) and Dr. Candace Thille (Director of Carnegie Mellon University's Open Learning Initiative). Our primary purpose for attending this conference is to meet with Higher Learning Commission leaders to begin the next steps toward our reaccreditation process. I plan to coordinate the reaccreditation process and write our self-study (with the help of all our Luna Family) and designate Dr. Martinez as our liaison with the Higher Learning Commission to address day-to-day details.

Dr. José García, Secretary for the New Mexico Higher Education Department (HED) has asked me to be part of a three person delegation who will attend a national conference (April 16-17) in Indianapolis to discuss the implementation of and recommend regulations for distance education. I am honored to represent New Mexico and have accepted the invitation. The Presidents' Forum, the Council of State Governments (CSG), the Regional Higher Education Compacts and the Commission on the Regulation of Postsecondary Distance Education have collaborated and designed the purpose of this conference to advance an effective and practical framework to achieve interstate reciprocity in the regulation of distance education. The purpose of composing this State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA) is

intended to broaden the availability of and access to accredited online degree programs by reducing state regulatory barriers while ensuring strong consumer safeguards.

Several years ago, Mr. Abelino Montoya, then LCC BOT secretary and I met with Julia Galbadón, President/CEO and Retha Shiplet, COO/Director of New Mexico Performance Excellence Awards (NMPEA) & Training Programs for Quality New Mexico to discuss the possibility of Luna Community College becoming a member of QNM. From that moment

forward, the rest is history. We were acknowledged for our well-structured (chain-of-command) organization, transparency, accountability, vision, focus on and service to students, weekly *Luna Light* and months later, we were acknowledged for the fine work of Dr. Vidal Martinez and our faculty and staff on the LCC - QNM application. As a result, we have been awarded the QNM Piñon Award and will be recognized for our efforts at the Quality New Mexico annual conference in Albuquerque on April 22-23. LCC's next step is to move towards the Roadrunner recognition phase.

I have spent my life teaching, counseling, advising and administering in private business and public education. My career and focus have been to prepare the students of our region for their future. I've helped to motivate, encourage and prepare students (who have come from poor, humble and hard working families) move forward by not giving up. For example: after being elected by their fellow classmates, area students have gone on to serve as University Student Government Presidents and advance to positions such as a successful Washington (federal agency) Director and a successful Albuquerque private-sector business owner. 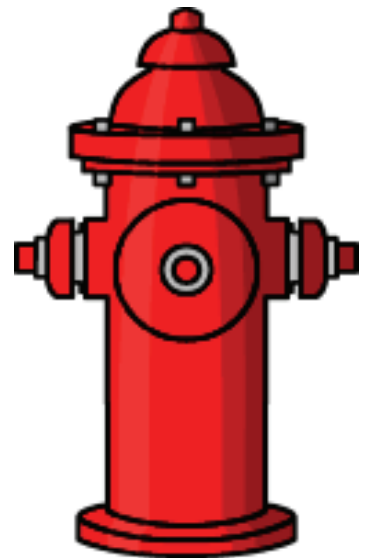

## This week in Admissions!

During the month of March, Jenzabar installed components necessary to begin implementing CRM Candidate module. Jenzabar trainers were at LCC providing three days of technical training on the reimplementation of the Admissions module which is necessary in order to get CRM Candidate module fully functional.

- Jenzabar conducted a needs assessment to determine which parts of the Admissions module were needed by review of every option available to them on the Admissions menu.
- Tables were reviewed to determine the local values that were needed to start tracking and inputted them all into the tables.
- They completed all the screen changes to incorporate some of the local fields that were needed to carry from the old process.
- On the last day of training, Jenzabar employees and LCC Lead Data Administrator Denise Gibson reviewed the online application and inquiry card and input it in the CRM tables for later use.

Admissions user training is scheduled to take place in April. Candidate technical and user training will follow and should be available for staff and student access by next semester.



## Hospital Beds are Here

Many nursing students say they learn best by “doing something” on a “real” patient. Simulation is setting the students up for this type of learning. The lab will be set up in a hospital-type setting in which most of the clinical time will take place. The arrival of the beds has started this process. There is an excitement among the students for a more realistically setup and learning experience.

To help facilitate this we have six bedroom suites. Each suite has an over bed table, bedside table and hospital bed as you would in a hospital setting. Each bed area will be wired for video recording of the simulations for re-viewing each scenario and evaluate the learning process of that clinical setting.

We will have a nurses’ station with electronic charting capability, a med cart for medication, as well as a crash cart. This will help prepare students for safer and more efficient “real-world” learning while decreasing anxiety of putting students in unfamiliar situations. The hospital beds are the first of many pieces of equipment that will complete our Simulation Lab.
