"I will get my Ph.D."

Rachel Ridgeway honored at Capitol as an all-state academic team member

Today, a Luna Community College physical science student, tomorrow a P.h.D. candidate.

This is the goal of LCC student Rachel Ridgeway, who along with several other community college students, were honored as All-State Academic team members at the Capitol on Wednesday.

Dr. Dan Lopez, president of New Mexico Tech in Socorro, one of the guest speakers at the event, spoke on the importance of an education. He said that those that attain a doctoral degree will make an average of \$5 million in their lifetime and that the unemployment rate for them is right about two percent.

"I'm getting that Ph.D.," says Ridge-

way, who will get a full-paid tuition scholarship to New Mexico State University in the fall. "It's super-amazing after all the struggles and downfalls that I've had. Maybe one day, I can come back and be president or come back and donate scholarship money for people like me."

The New Mexico All-State Academic Team works in conjunction with Phi Theta Kappa. Ridgeway is LCC's Phi Theta Kappa President.

"I am extremely grateful for the representation by Rachel Ridgeway during this awards assembly," said LCC President Dr. Pete Campos. "Her achievement has brought great recognition to Luna Community College."

Luna Community College receives a “clean audit”

Luna Community College received an unqualified opinion by Moss-Adams' partner Scott Eliason at Wednesday's board of trustees meeting. The unqualified opinion, is also referred to as “clean”, is the highest opinion possible.

“While it's highly unlikely there would not be any audit findings on any audit, the college is always taking steps to improve, strengthen practices and correct findings,” said LCC Vice-President of Finance Donna Flores-Medina.

According to the auditor, none of the findings were material to the financial statements and Luna Community College qualified as a “low risk auditee.”

Because the audit focuses primarily on the financial and internal controls of the college, there is a high standard set for the college's processes and personnel involved. Federal, state and college level laws, rules and regulations are involved. This audit does not assess the in-

struction component of the college.


“Again, we have earned a clean (unqualified) financial audit,” said LCC President Dr. Pete Campos. “I am especially pleased that our operational, management and program funds and human resource procedures and standards are in compliance and focused on optimum student success,”—*Dr. Pete Campos*





Four of seven seats on the Luna Board of Trustees are up for election this year. The election is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, March 5.

The seats that are up for election are District 1, District 3, District 5 and District 7. All are for a six-year term beginning on April 1. District 1 candidates are: Thomas Jerry Maestas and Kenneth C. Medina; District 3 candidates are: Peter A. Martinez, Levi Alcon Jr. and Ernie Chavez; District 5 candidates are: Abelman Montoya Jr. and Anthony D. Marquez; District 7 candidates are: Richard N. Rivera, Daniel J. Romero and Joann Alcon-Ortiz.

The polls will be open between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., on the day of the election. The polling place for District 1 is Mike Marr Gymnasium; the polling places for District 3 are: David Cargo Library, Holman Elementary School, Buena Vista Fire Department and Mike Mateo Elementary; The polling place for District 5 is Mike Marr Gymnasium and the polling places for District 7 are: Valley Junior High Gymnasium, Bernal Community Center and Mike Marr Gymnasium.

Absentee voting is also an option. Absentee voting is taking at the Mora and San Miguel County Clerk's office until 5 p.m. Friday, March 1.

Baseball, softball team lose to Trinidad State

Both the Luna Community College baseball and softball team lost two games to Trinidad State Junior College over the weekend.

The baseball team is now 1-13 on the season, losing 3-2 and 4-1. The softball team dropped to 4-7 after losing 15-0 and 6-5.

The Rough Riders will open their conference season as they travel to Texas on Friday and Saturday to take on El Paso Community College. A doubleheader is scheduled for both days.

"That was by far our worst games we played, but it was a great learning tool for us," said LCC Coach Antonio Siqueiros. "We are excited to open up conference play; we are confident we can compete in our conference. We are having trouble putting teams away. We are going to mix and match against El Paso. The scouting reports indicates

that they are a pitching team. Our record doesn't indicate how good we are. We are going to use our preseason to our advantage."

The Lady Rough Riders begin a home stand on Sunday as they take on Trinidad State. Game times are for noon and 2 p.m.

"The first game definitely got away from us," said LCC Interim Coach Nathan Trujillo. "We struck out 10 times. You're not going to win many times when you strike out that much."

Trujillo expects a better outcome this Sunday.

"I'm excited to get a lot of fans out there," said Trujillo. "I believe our team learned from their mistakes and we will have a better game than we did this weekend."

LCC also hosts Lamar on Tuesday and Wednesday.
