LCC offering summer program for high school students

Luna Community College will again offer an enhanced college credit summer program for upcoming classified high school juniors and seniors. For several years, Luna Community College has offered the Student Academic Advancement Institute (SAAI). This year, it will run from Monday, June 3 to Friday, July 26. Registration begins on Tuesday, April 2 and runs through Friday, June 7.

The program provides: free tuition for up to nine credit hours, textbook waiver, an access code waiver and a distance learning fee waiver. Tuition is not covered for students that are home-schooled or in private school.

Upon successful completion of their courses with an acceptable passing grade, students will receive a \$100 stipend.

The program is designed to enhance educational opportunities and help students achieve academic success and sup-

port their educational goals. Other advantages that SAAI students receive are:

- Participation in student activities
- Introduction to a college environment
- Encouragement to pursue a college degree at either at a two- year college or four-year university.
- Forming a pathway between their current school, Luna Community College and to a four-year institution.
- Awarded an opportunity to be challenged and grow both academically as well as personally.
- Earning college credit while still in high school.

The SAAI program has 130 slots available. All Luna Community College entrance requirements apply to this program. Students are required to fill out a packet available at the Luna Community College ACCESS Center.

Students in the SAAI Program may register for any course listed in the summer 2013 course schedule. Prerequisites must be met. Students

can view the Luna Community College Summer Schedule for a list of classes at www.luna.edu. General education core classes transfer to four-year universities.

Lady Rough Riders take 3 from Clarendon

The Luna Community College Lady Rough Riders are proving that they not only belong in a conference, but that they can also compete.

The Lady Rough Riders took three of four games from Clarendon College on the road over the weekend. After dropping the first game 5-4, they won 13-5, 9-1 and 13-9.

Renee Roybal was the winning pitcher in two of the games, pitching all 14 innings. Veronica Holloman took the other win for Luna Community College.

"It was good to get back in conference games," said LCC Interim Coach Nathan Trujillo.

The Lady Rough Riders got some great performances offensively from several players. Among them were Celeste Paiz who hit two home runs and collected

six hits. Kaitlyn Gross had eight hits and Marissa Valencia added seven hits.

Gross is ranked in the top 15 in the nation with nine home runs on the year. She is also ranked in the top 20 in batting average, hitting right around the .500 clip.

The Lady Rough Riders will host Otero Community College on Tuesday. Games will be played at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m.

They will host Frank Phillips College on Thursday and Friday in a conference home opener. Thursday's games are scheduled for 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. Friday's games are scheduled for 11 a.m. and 1 p.m.

The baseball team took the weekend off and will travel to Borger, Texas and take on Frank Phillips College on Friday and Saturday.

Rachel Ridgeway, a student at Luna Community College, has been named a 2013 Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team Silver Scholar. The Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation sponsors the Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team program by recognizing 50 Gold, 50 Silver and 50 Bronze Scholars, and providing nearly \$200,000 in scholarships annually. Each Silver Scholar receives a \$1,250 scholarship and a special medallion.

Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society administers the Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team Program and recognizes Coca-Cola Community College scholars during All-State Community College Academic Team Recognition ceremonies held in 38 states. Student scholars also receive recognition locally during ceremonies held on campus and internationally for those who are able to attend Phi Theta Kappa's Annual Convention.

Community college presidents or their designated nominators may submit no more than two nominations per campus for this award. An independent panel of judges considers outstanding academic rigor, grade point average, academic and leadership awards, and

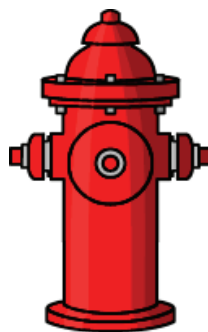
