LCC-Springer Satellite enhancements and accomplishments over the past few years

- Title V/Smart Lab – Title V implemented a new computer lab in December 2009 which has strengthened the technology service for distance learning.
- Dual-Credit – Close collaboration with local high schools: Cimarron, Maxwell, Springer, and Raton where we offer several dual credit courses in academics and vocational education. Some of the high schools transport their students to the Springer Satellite to attend classes with many taking advantage of our distance learning (online) courses.
- Healthcare Career Pathways (2-year) Program for Raton High School- We were very instrumental in forming a “Healthcare Career Pathways” Program in Raton and partnering with: Raton High School, Miners Colfax Medical Center-Long Term Care, New Mexico Highlands University, and Colfax County. Students have had an opportunity to receive dual credit as well as prepare them for a career in the medical field. LCC provides Raton High School students with the online curriculum delivery along with onsite CNA courses. In May 2014, a third group of students, which consists of 10 high school students, will complete the two-year program.
- Mass Communication Courses at Cimarron High School – LCC -Springer partnered with Cimarron HS to provide dual credit Mass Communication courses. Cimarron HS offers Video Production, Web Design, Graphic Arts/design, and Broadcast Productions to high school students who were given the opportunity to receive college credits.
- Cimarron Community – Our Furniture Cabinet Making Instructor, Patricia Kuhlman, travels to Cimarron once a week to offer a Furniture Cabinet Making course to high school students and community members because of a partnership with Cimarron HS where LCC utilizes their vocational facility to offer a course each semester.
- Community Education courses in Raton:
 - Lead Paint Certification - LCC formed a partnership with GrowRaton and Santa Fe Community College and individuals were given an opportunity to obtain Lead Paint Certification.
- Green Advantage Environment Certification (Commercial/Residential) – LCC developed a curriculum for credited and/or community courses in the areas of green jobs (certification to building energy efficient buildings). LCC partnered with GrowRaton and Colfax Workforce Development Center and courses consisted of: Introduction to Building Science, Thermal By-Pass and Advance Framing Techniques, and Green Advantage Certified Professionals.
- Customer Relations Workshop/Training – Partnered with Colfax Workforce Development Center and Joe Rodman where individuals received customer training that ranged from how to listen and handle problems/conflict, to how to defuse a difficult situation. Students received certificates when the workshop/training was completed.
- Local Organizations - We are very active members of the Springer Chamber of Commerce and Springer Economic Development as well as members of GrowRaton and Raton Chamber of Commerce. In addition, LCC-Springer Satellite has become an area and community meeting facility. Many meetings and gatherings have been hosted in the Forrester building.
- New Mexico Highlands University Raton Site-LCC Springer Satellite and NMHU Raton Site formed a merger where LCC offers core courses at the NMHU Raton Site for students seeking degrees and/or upgrading skills. The delivery method is done onsite, online, and by ITV and LCC started offering the courses during the 2013 spring semester.
- STEM/Health Science courses in Raton – LCC provided onsite courses as part of the STEM and Nursing Programs to students in the Raton, Springer, and surrounding areas. We offered the courses at Raton High School. This gave high students and students seeking a certificate/degree an opportunity to take the courses in Raton without having to travel to Las Vegas. The courses consisted of General Biology I and II and Human Anatomy and Physiology I and II.
- Workforce Readiness Program Grant and Youth Conservation Grant Collaboration between Raton High School and Luna Community College - In September 2013, Raton High School was awarded grants for Workforce Readiness Program and the Youth Conservation Corp. Raton High School collaborated with LCC for the educational component. LCC provides dual credit accreditation for courses that will align with NCCER Career Technical Education (CTE) courses that will be offered. Presently, the courses that LCC is offering are through the Building Technology Program and Mr. Mark Honeyfield, Vocational Education Instructor at Raton High School, who was responsible in obtaining these grants. Awarded grant amounts are: Workforce Readiness Program Grant (WRP): \$80,000.00 and Youth Conservation Corp Grant (YCC): \$199,000.
- Equipment Sharing – LCC was instrumental in obtaining unused ITV equipment from Raton High School for ITV courses at Springer and Santa Rosa Satellite. They were purchased through a grant that Raton High School had obtained in partnership with us. The value of each of the ITVs are \$23,000 which is a cost saving for LCC.

- Forrester Building – The original flooring in the Forrester building has been rehabbed and stands out. Our General Maintenance I employee, Joseph Smith, has worked very hard to make the facility look better and more welcoming. He has done an outstanding job.
- Hybrid Courses – Sherry Goodyear, Humanities began offering hybrid

courses during the Fall 2013 semester where she taught online and onsite courses simultaneously. This has provided our students both the scheduling flexibility with online learning and the personal interactions provided by face-to-face learning.

- Recently LCC-Springer Satellite secured \$330,000 for architectural services for renovation projects (HVAC and roofing). At this year's legislative session, a capital outlay proposal was introduced for \$300,000 for the renovation projects for the Springer Satellite and funds were secured.
- Springer Correctional Center – LCC partnered with the Springer Correctional Center in offering vocational education courses in Automotive Technology and Culinary Arts to the inmates. A structured curriculum consists of both instructional and practi-

cal skills, which will prepare students to continue their educational efforts in the career areas and eventually obtain a certificate/degree.

With technology driving the future, we want to provide our area students and constituents an opportunity to secure a quality education and achieve their goals. Our intentions are to work hand-in-hand with the main campus to acquire funding through grants and other means.

We feel it is important to provide students in the rural areas educational opportunities and helping them reach their goals whether it is by obtaining a certificate and/or degree or by taking a class for professional and personal enrichment. Students have always been able to go away to college, but for so many it is not possible because of financial and family constraints. Having the Springer Satellite in the middle of northeastern New Mexico means students

in the rural area can attain an education without experiencing such a heavy financial burden—a burden that would most likely keep them from attending school at all.

The Springer Satellite provides a valuable educational need. Students feel comfortable attending here because of our friendly staff and faculty, and our wide array of course offerings. Though we are located in a rural area where people are scattered, the student who take advantage of our services go on to better themselves and ultimately our community. Our wonderful little satellite allows that to happen.

Santa Rosa students happy to have building technologies program

Santa Rosa High School student Pryce Mares is happy building technology courses are being taught. A partnership between Luna Community College and Santa Rosa High has allowed high school students like Mares along with community members to take building technology courses beginning this past fall semester.

“It’s a good class,” said Mares who is taking introduction to furniture making this semester. “Mr. Flores (instructor David Flores) has taught me a lot of things I wouldn’t have learned without his help and patience. I am going to take his class again next year. I like this type of class because it is more hands-on.”

Mares along with other students are taking building technologies as concurrent enrollment, meaning that credits will be counted at both the high school and college level.

“In our introduction to furniture and cabinet making class we are at full capacity with 11 students; that’s what we can handle at this time,” said LCC and Santa Rosa Building Technologies Instructor David Flores who is teaching three high school classes and one evening class for the community. “It has exceeded my expecta-

tions.”

Flores intends to teach advanced classes next semester.

“This is something that hasn’t existed in Santa Rosa High in 30 years or so; we’ve started at ground zero,” said Flores who is certified by the National Center for Construction Education and Research and through OSHA.

The classes are taught for one hour five times a week.

“Right now we are working with the school board with general obligation bond money to erect a vocational building,” said Santa Rosa High Principal Richard Perea. “It supports our career college readiness. I’m very pleased; I’ve seen the kids enthusiasm for trades and woods.”

Flores says that the program will only get better.

“I’m looking forward to the day when we get sophomores in here and guide them through senior year,” said Flores. “They will get to do some quality pieces. I would like to see them be self sufficient to build furniture and get them excited about the construction business.”

Turning Point:

Within time I began to feel energetic and overall healthier. I decided to change my diet and started to eat healthier and cut out high fat foods, processed foods and soda. I began to supplement water and tea for my beverage intake. I added more vegetables, fruits and lean meats. Preparing meals ahead of time has made a difference for me and my families eating habits."

Her life now:

Antonia has made a commitment to attend LCC Wellness Center four to five days out of the week to continue her progress said Antonia, "I now feel healthier and happier; I am now participating in line dancing and Zumba four days out of the week as well as weight training and cardio endurance program. I have participated in The Relay for Life and I am more confident getting involved with new activities and trying new things, and most of all I can now play with my grandchildren without getting tired."

Secrets to my success:

Cardio 90 minutes x 4-5 days a week

Strength training 30 minutes x 3 days a week

"In the beginning going to the Wellness Center was difficult but knowing I had to do it for my health and my well being was my



motivator. Now I feel if I don't attend the gym on a daily basis I am cheating myself."

"Dawnette, Carl, and Joe have guided and assisted me in my success. They have educated and assisted me on tips and advice regarding a safe and productive workout program.
