Tapaha has record-setting day *Lady Rough Riders hit six home runs in loss*

On Friday, Elisse Tapaha did the same thing for the Luna Community College Lady Rough Riders.

Tapaha, a sophomore from Fort Defiance, Ariz., hit a home run in her first three at bats against Lamar Community College at Rodriguez Park.

"I've never seen anything like that in either my playing or coaching career," said LCC Head Softball Coach Meredith Gilpin. "It takes discipline. I always talk to my players about discipline at the plate."

The Lady Rough Riders ended up losing the game 12-11, but they did bounce back to win the final game of the series 10-2. LCC lost the first two games on Thursday 9-3 and 11-2.

But Friday's first home game was about the long ball. Aside from Tapaha's record-setting day, teammate Krynisha Betoni hit two home runs. Kaitlyn Gross also hit one out of the park.

"We just have to get better every day," says Gilpin. "We don't want to take steps back; we need to keep building for next year."

The Lady Rough Riders are now 9-26 on the year. The LCC Baseball Team improved to 15-23 after sweeping Oklahoma Panhandle State Junior Varsity 11-4 and 8-5.

The Lady Rough Riders are scheduled to play the Colby Community College Tourney this Saturday and Sunday.

The Rough Riders are scheduled to play the Lubbock Christian Junior Varsity team on Friday and Saturday on the road.

Working together makes it work

This is the first in a series of interviews with department leaders at Luna Community College. The following interview is with Vice-President of Finance and Administration Donna Flores-Medina.

**What departments do you oversee?
What is each department's responsibilities?**

Departments under my supervision include:

- Fiscal (Business Office)
- Financial Aid
- Bookstore
- Cafeteria
- Institutional Research
- Purchasing/Shipping/Receiving
- Title V

**How long have you worked at LCC?
In what capacity?**

I began my career in Higher Education on June 12, 2000, after I applied for Director of Fiscal Operations and was hired as Ivan Roper was retiring from his long career with LCC. Dr. Lawrence Pino was president then. With a change in administration the position of Vice

President of Finance and Administration was vacant and I applied for it the summer of 2001. I was hired into that position under then new President, Leroy Sanchez, and though my title has been changed over the years, my responsibilities remain and have grown. With two interim presidents in between, President, Dr. Pete Campos continues to lead and challenge me to do more, do better, keep growing all for the good of the college.

What is a typical day like?

There really is not a typical day as the complexity and volume of work varies certain times of the year. For example; budget time, registration, year-end closing, new year set up and audit periods are additionally challenging and are added to the "normal" duties.

Normal duties are reviewing and approving each and every purchase made, reviewing special procurement requirements, reviewing all hires, adjunct, part-time, full time etc. Reviewing with the PDP Committee all Travel and Activity reports, reviewing most agreements

and contracts, answering budget questions, communicating with the Higher Education Department by the numerous reports required, evaluating proposals for the college, meetings on a regular basis with the Leadership Advisory Team and others as needed, preparing for and attending on a monthly basis-Finance Committee meetings, Board Work sessions and Board meetings, etc.. Supervision of the departments under my division and assisting students as matters come to my attention are also part of the "normal" duties.

What are your primary duties?

The position I hold:

Develops the annual budget in cooperation with designated College personnel and oversees the administration of the budget. Coordinates and oversees the auditing process.

Serves as a member of the Leadership Advisory Team and advises the President on areas of responsibility.

Has review and/or approval responsibility of all financial transactions of the college including but not limited to payroll contracts, purchasing transactions, and external contracts.

Establishes policies and programs related to fiscal affairs and attendant support services of the Institute; oversees all curricular and co-curricular functions as they relate to, planning and development, fiscal planning and administration.

Provides for fiscal and support services including accounting, budgeting, contract administration, administrative computing and information processing; directs and manages functions related to the college's financial resources including loan collection, debt management, internal auditing and managing investments; oversees campus bookstore, cafeteria, purchasing, Shipping and Receiving, Financial Aid, Institutional Research and other fiscal matters via oversight of Fiscal Office Supervisor. Under Risk Management or budget related matters, assists in some capacity, physical facilities' planning, operations and maintenance including utilities, energy conservation, environmental health and safety, grounds, maintenance, safety and security, capital planning, assets control and facility usage.

Coordinates all financial and administrative functions to ensure optimum efficiency and compliance to appropriate policies and procedures according to the mission set forth by the LCC Board of Directors; as a member of the LAT active in the assessment, development and administration of resources.

Assists operating units in defining strategies and developing plans to ensure continued growth and prosperity of the academic enterprise; interacts regularly with other administrators and college committees coordinating data collection and analysis for planning, decision-making and resource allocations.

Provides leadership and coordinates the College's learning support services programs with the campus community, high schools, parents, prospective students, and special interest groups; confers with and advises staff, students and others to provide technical advice, problem solving assistance, answers to questions and interpretation of program goals.

Is involved in contract negotiation, legal matter resolutions, and formulation of joint ventures or memorandums of understanding.

Where do you see yourself and your departments in five years?

One of our goals is to automate more of our systems to provide better service to students and staff. We'd like to be fully automated to include direct deposit of Financial Aid, we continue to look for funding to convert to Banner, fully integrate the cafeteria and bookstore systems and get additional funding to address all the needs of every department and the college as a whole. As we seek to improve customer service, we will implement more training to give our staff and students a great experience at LCC.

What is the best part of your job?

I have appreciated the responsibility and challenge of the enormity of the job to keep

LCC in compliance with the many laws, rules and regulations and at the same time see myself and employees develop as we work together, learn from each other and improve how we get the work done.

What is the toughest part of your job?

Because there is so much to stay on top of and be aware of and anticipate, it's tough to be 100 percent sure something doesn't get missed. No one can be 100 percent perfect but sometimes it's hard to make decisions that others may not fully agree with or understand. It's tough to be under great scrutiny by many internal and external entities but I know its part of the job. There would be serious consequences if we did not adhere to the many regulations and requirements.

Where do you see opportunities to grow?

There are many opportunities to grow; from learning to see others views, to attending ongoing training in my area, to reaching out to help train others, to continually seeking the Lord for wisdom and guidance in this vast job.

What is on your bucket list?

I would like to help our friends in Puerto Vallarta who help the poor children through the work of the church.

What are some of the successes and visions of the departments you oversee, (be specific, for example financial aid)?

There have been many successes but to touch on a few: at Fiscal Office they have implemented the on-line payment system giving students a convenient alternative to addressing their student account; at the Financial Aid office, we moved up the disbursement of student aid up by one week and have a goal to cut back by one additional week as they now have an Associate Director and are fully staffed moving towards increased automation; at the Bookstore, we implemented Booklog and course works, automating book ordering and

inventory functions as well as set up the interface with CARS for better service and accountability; at the Cafeteria we have hired part-time staff for cross-training to assist the manager in order to have continuity of services in his absence as well implemented a meal plan card for student use and convenience; at Institutional Research, the Director seeks ways to improve the validity of data and is heading the strategic plan process; the Purchasing department has launched on-line auctions and on-line posting of RFPs; Title V, thanks to the leadership of the director, as I was just recently given the assignment to oversee closeout, has been recognized at LCC, at the state level and on a national level for its overall success in administration of the grant which focused on on-line learning.

What is the overall budget the college works with on an annual basis and how have we've been doing on our audits?

The budget fluctuates depending on the number and amounts of grants and contracts but it's currently a \$21,055,131. Our audits have been "Unqualified" which is the best rating. While we will always have audit findings due to the nature and number of transactions at the college, we use those as opportunities to tighten process and improve controls.

You teach Zumba in the evenings, how is that going?

Zumba Fitness has been challenging due to the amount of time to prepare and I've thought of giving it up but then it's so encouraging to work out with many who really like this alternative to traditional exercise.

Is there anything you would like to say to the students and staff at LCC?

To students, stay in school, your investment is worth the time and effort. To staff, be your best at all times. To all, I am here to assist in any way I can and my door is open to meet with everyone.
