## LCC to host Quilt Show

LCC Quilting and Sewing Instructor Lin Chibonte said that about 25 to 30 items will be on display.

“My students have worked really hard to put on this show,” says Chibonte. “There are four classes that have worked on this project.”

“There will also be a lot of decorative pillow cases,” says Chibonte.

“One of our community projects this semester has been to donate pillow cases and matching Teddy Bears to the CASA Organization. Many of these kids have been moved out of their homes and placed into foster homes. We want each of these kids to have something to hold on to.”

Potential students that are interested in sewing or quilting have the choice of taking classes that teach beginning to advanced skills.

“If you are a beginner and want to quilt or sew don’t hesitate because we start at the skill level of each student,” says Chibonte.
