## LCC networking a success in Raton

Healthcare Career Pathways held a program success reception earlier this month at the Raton High School Media Center. Students were recognized for their completion of the two-year program and all partners were presented with plaques and/or certificates.

Luna Community College partnered with the Raton Public Schools, Miners’ Colfax Medical Center, and New Mexico Highlands University in 2010 to work on this two-year healthcare program initiative. The pathway program provided high school juniors and seniors with hands-on experience. The initiative was designed for students to have a seamless transition from high school into a higher education institution with completion of many core courses, which are required within healthcare degree programs in college.

A major component of the pathways was to instruct students on how to deliver quality healthcare and the importance of performance improvement functions in all aspects of healthcare. The program had an emphasis on customer service skills and the delivery of quality healthcare.

A structured curriculum consisted of both instructional and practical skills, which has prepared them to continue

their educational efforts in the healthcare field. Students that completed this healthcare pathway program now have the skills and abilities to test to become a certified nursing assistant and will either become employed in the healthcare area or continue in their studies of healthcare professions such as a licensed practical nurse, registered nurse or other allied healthcare positions. The goal of the initiative was to recruit and retain individuals in the

healthcare field in Colfax County. The six primary communities in Colfax County all have healthcare professional shortages. Raton, which is the largest of the six communities, has a community hospital, Long Term Care facility, family practice associates, internal medicine, ob/gyn and general surgery services available.

Luna Community College delivered the online curriculum. Miners’ Colfax Medical Center providing the clinical aspect of the two-year program where students received hands-on experience. This allowed students to work side-by-side with a mentoring healthcare team. The program started with 15 students and ended with 13. We are very proud of these students!

# The Importance of Online Services

I have the privilege of teaching in an online format for Luna Community College on an adjunct basis; rather, the facts are presented because these are the real issues that real people face every day. While the facts may be disturbing, I believe they present an opportunity for institutions of higher education that offer **online learning opportunities**.

Online learning is delivered in asynchronous, synchronous, or combined formats. The asynchronous format requires students to involve themselves in a system of self-paced learning guided by instructors through online bulletin boards, online discussion groups and e-mail. This system of learning may also be totally self-contained with links to reference materials in place of a live instructor. Synchronous formats of delivery are done in real-time with a live instructor facilitating the training. Luna Community College provides online learning in a synchronous format which allows for instant responses and feedback between students and instructors. Institutions that combine a blended format share a combination of both online learning environments.

A student's propensity to engage in online learning is derived by the individual's personal circumstances and their preference for a learning environment. I have had the opportunity to facilitate the learning of students living in San Miguel, Mora, Colfax, Santa Rosa, Santa Fe, Bernalillo, and Dona Ana counties; as well as the states of Colorado, South Dakota, and South Carolina. Every student I serve has a story and brings a unique perspective to class. Many are single parents, some are unemployed, others are underemployed; some are seeking educational or workplace advancement, some are working themselves out of poverty, and others are engaged in acquiring a technical degree or lifelong learning while some of their peers are first generation college attendees. Whatever the story of our students might be, we must remember that that they chose online learning at Luna Community College.

In the spirit of continuous improvement, administrators of online learning programs must perform a systems check every once in awhile to make sure that our systems and delivery methods are meeting the needs of the students that come to us. Through this systems check, we must evaluate if we are reaching the greatest number of potential students using the synchronous delivery format or if we are missing the opportunity to serve students in a blended format so to provide an opportunity for those that cannot commit to the designated time offering of the course. As online faculty, we must determine if we are addressing the different modalities of the students' learning styles and preference or any special needs that must be addressed for creating effective opportunities to learn. Natural relationships for accountability occur in the regular classroom setting, in the online format we must continue to be innovative in our methodologies to establish that relationships with students so there is personal "real people" accountability and not accountability to a machine. In addition to serving students in an online format, our ability to make initial contact with a student via phone and maintain a relationship by phone can mean the difference between the student passing and failing a course.

It's worth remembering also that some students become reluctant participants once in the online environment and this can hinder their ability to adequately perform, activity communicate and learn effectively. In the case when a students' life circumstances only permits for an online course without any other choices, we as instructors need to be aware of the situation and deal with the differences between those who prefer online learning and who do not. It is incumbent on us as online faculty to create an effective online learning environment that meets the diversified needs of students.

In closing, there is a growing consensus that new models in education are needed to expand knowledge of human capital needed for the recovery of our economy. Luna Community College plays a vital role in our community's share of economic recovery by developing our workforce through offering quality programs of study centered on high wage, high skill and high demand occupations which positions our students to be competitive when hiring is fiercely competitive. Because we are a community college that focuses on academic and occupational skill development that meets the needs of business and industry, we confidently know that our students are earning a good education for a modest price and therefore won't need to be preoccupied with excessive student loan debt once they leave us. Furthermore, through our vast course offerings available in an online format, our students don't have to choose between going to work to support the family or earning a degree, nor do they have to choose between being home for their children or going to school to acquire a competitive skill set. **Online learning will never replace face-to-face teaching and learning, but it does provide opportunities some of our students wouldn't otherwise have.**

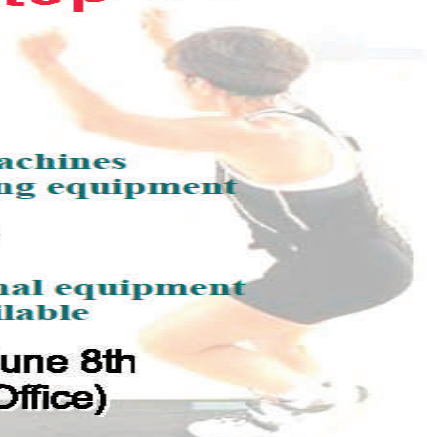

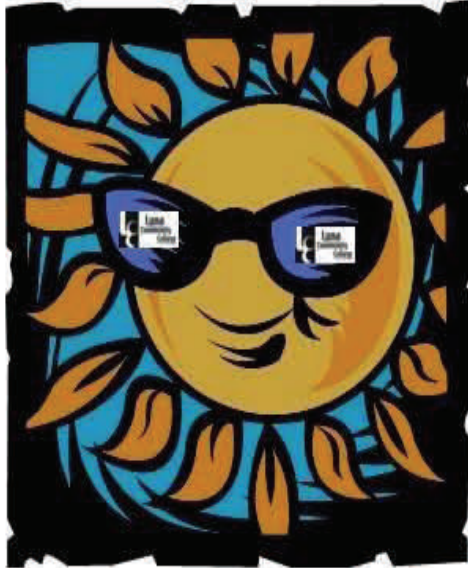
