Breaking News for January

- The Annual Performance Report (APR) for Year 3 was submitted to the Department of Education. A months work of preparation, review, and finalization was accomplished by all Title V personnel. The outcome of the report showed an increase in pilot of automotive courses.
- Internal Evaluation Team (IET) Advisory meeting was held January 12, 2016 bringing in the New Year with 19 members present to discuss the current project and initiatives.
