Luna CC to provide online classes to new program

Luna Community College will be providing online classes to a new Healthcare Career Pathways Program that will allow high school students to receive dual-credit courses to prepare them for careers in the medical field. The goal is to recruit and retain individuals in the healthcare field in Colfax County. Luna Community College will be partnering with the Raton Public Schools, Miners Colfax Medical Center, and New Mexico Highlands University to work on this two-year program initiative. LCC will deliver the online curriculum beginning with medical terminology during the 2010 fall semester and

introduction to psychology during the 2011 spring semester. MCMC will provide the clinical aspect of the two-year program where students will receive hands-on experience and it will allow students to work side by side with a mentoring healthcare team.

The purpose of the Health Care Training Program is to give students and residents in rural communities the opportunity to develop job skills and eventually practice in a health care field. Not only will participants gain valuable skills, the curriculum will give participants the opportunity to gain college credit that can be applied to a college degree or certificate program.
