Concurrent Enrollment Program Guidelines

The purpose of the Concurrent Enrollment Program for Secondary Students is to provide a select number of high school students an opportunity to enroll for courses at Luna Community College (LCC) to earn college credit while still in high school. Concurrent enrollment, by contrast, may result in a student earning college credit while in high school, but does not result in a student earning high school credits.

Student/Parent Information

- 1.) Students who would like to take college courses *without having the courses recorded on their high school transcripts* may enroll as concurrent students.
- 2.) Students who wish to take *courses not approved by their high school as a Dual Credit course* may also enroll as a concurrent student.

There are two types of high school enrollment

A Dual Credit student:

- is enrolled in an accredited public, private, charter high school, or home school, and
- is permitted by parents and high school authorities to apply for admission, and
- if accepted, will earn college credit toward a certificate/degree *and* high school credit toward high school graduation.
- tuition is waived by the College and textbooks are supplied by the high school.

A Concurrent Enrollment student:

- is enrolled in an accredited public, private, charter high school, or home school, and
- will only earn college credit toward a certificate/degree *and not* toward high school graduation, *and*
- tuition is waived by the College and the student/parent are responsible for some costs related to enrollment, including textbooks.

Student/Parent Acknowledgements & Responsibilities

I understand that I will be in a college environment and I am responsible for being aware of and adhering to the LCC Student Handbook, LCC Catalog, including the Student Code of Conduct. I agree to adhere to all important dates and deadlines (e.g. course drop date, course withdrawal date, and finals week schedule) established by the College.

I understand that as a student of LCC I have access to the library, course related labs and other instructional facilities, use of programs and services such as counseling, tutoring, advising, and special services.

Students who apply for concurrent enrollment are admitted to LCC under a special 'non-degree seeking' category. Upon completion, the courses will appear on an official LCC transcript.

Students admitted to the concurrent enrollment program are subject to all College academic regulations including those governing attendance, minimum grade point average, add/drop and withdrawal.

Students are not eligible for state or federal financial aid while enrolled in high school. However, because the courses they are enrolling for are recorded on the college transcript, grades earned for college courses taken while in high school can impact a student's future financial aid.

All students, regardless of age, are protected by the Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). FERPA provides the student with the right to review, restrict access and seek amendment to his/her educational records. FERPA prevents the release of any information, other than Directory information, to anyone (including parents) without written consent from the student. FERPA rights transfer from the parent to the student upon enrollment in a post-secondary institution.
