- Students should create an account with ATI prior to the exam date (if you do not already have an account set up). To create an account, go to www.atitesting.com click on Create Account next to Log In. (Use Luna CC ADN for institution and estimated graduation date of 5/11/2026.) Please use your Luna email to set up ATI account.
- On the day of your exam, please arrive 10 minutes early* to log in and purchase the exam. The cost of the exam is \$70. You will need to bring a debit/credit card to purchase the exam and a photo ID for identification verification. No food or drinks are permitted in the testing site. A calculator is available in ATI and the proctor will provide paper and

pencils for use during the exam. All materials will be collected by the proctor before you leave the exam site.

Watch Party for Wildlife Resiliency Video

- On Tuesday, February 27, 2024, several Luna employees gathered to view two commercial's showcasing Luna's new Wildfire Resiliency Training Center. Featuring special appearances by several Luna employees including Dr. Edward Martinez, Francisco Apodaca, and Denise Fox, the commercials gave an overview of the new program and the purpose behind it.
- The program is lead by its Director, Raphael, D'Amato who is housed in the General Studies Building (the old Humanities Building). The program was born after Dr. Martinez saw the need for trained professionals who could help will prevention, fighting, and recovery from any future catastrophic fires after the Calf Canyon/Hermit's Peak fire that devasted roughly 534 acres of land in the Las Vegas area in 2022.
- At present the program offers classes for non-credit, but once the program is fully developed and the planning team hopes to eventually offer 4 certificates and 4 associate's degrees then anyone taking one of the current non-credit courses will earn retroactive credit for it towards one of the certificate or associate degree programs offered. The program will also include Heritage Trades courses. Director D'Amato is open for any suggestions or ideas people want to share about the different certifications Luna will be offering and is available via his email at rdamato@luna.edu.
