Luna to host Annual Girls Can Event

Two events scheduled for April 27 and May 4

For the second consecutive year, Luna Community College will be hosting the local Girls Can event. This year there are two separate sessions, Thursday, April 27 and Thursday, May 4 so that the college can include girls from most of the local schools. Both events are scheduled at Luna's main campus in Las Vegas.

Girls Can is an initiative of the American Association of University Women, (AAUW) Las Vegas Branch. Women who have gone on to success in various fields, especially those that do not traditionally seem as women's careers, will be the featured presenters. They will conduct hands-on workshops and speak to students about their experiences and the opportunities available through education and career pathways.

Last year, nearly 200 fifth grade girls from school districts in San Miguel, Mora, Colfax and Guadalupe counties participated in the Girls Can event at Luna. The fifth graders participated in 16 workshops or presentations in various fields. The girls experienced a college campus as well as met several successful women professionals. Other women guided them around campus between classes and talked with the girls about opportunities available to them. They all had lunch at the school before

Luna baseball holding on to second place in Region 9 baseball standings

The Luna baseball team continues to hold on to second place in the Region 9 South Division baseball standings with a 10-11 record. The Rough Riders trail Trinidad State who sport an 11-9 record.

The Rough Riders recently finished up a series against Northeastern Junior College where they went 2-2. On Wednesday of last week, Luna swept two games from the Adams State Junior Varsity team.

Luna's Jose Villalobos has 16 homeruns on the year trailing only the nation's top home run leaders by one. Villalobos is also No. 32 in the nation in hitting .425. Teammate Wilmer Henriquez is 49th hitting at a .421 clip.

As a team, the Rough Riders are 16th in the nation in with 51.

homeruns, 14th in doubles, eighth in hits and ninth in total bases.

The Rough Riders play at Otero College this weekend.

The Luna softball team recently split four games with McCook Community College winning 8-0 and 3-2. The Lady Rough Riders are 5-9 in conference and will participate later this year in the postseason.

Luna hosts Northeastern Junior College this weekend. The games will be held on Thursday, April 6, Friday, April 7 and Saturday, April 8.

Luna is ranked 45th in the nation in hitting with a .356 clip. The Lady Rough Riders are 75th in doubles with 51.

"The young ladies attending this year's events will see all the exciting and new programs Luna has to offer," said Linder. "The hope is that many will consider going into some of these fields."

Carla Romero, another veteran educator, said the local AAUW chapter has been conducting the Girls

Can event for nearly two decades in Las Vegas and San Miguel County. She pointed out that AAUW focuses on reducing early gender bias and encourages female students to pursue higher education – including fields of study to which they have not traditionally been steered.

Romero said she grew up in Wagon Mound and while she encountered good role models such as teachers and principals, there were many more potential career fields to which she and others had little to no exposure. "We want (Girls Can participants) to think girls can be anything they want to be, as long as they work at it," Romero said. "They shouldn't limit themselves. They shouldn't limit the careers they

pursue."

Professors, instructors and career women from Luna, Highlands, and the community are expected to be featured presenters. Workshops will include a wide variety of topics including how to apply an Ace bandage to an ankle, computer coding, identifying insects found in our local forests, treating the injuries of student athletics, the life of an artist, fire science, and much more.

Luna Strong is excited to announce the winner of the Luna Strong Mural Contest. Alex Allington, a Las Vegas native and former LCC student, created a beautiful submission that won the hearts and votes of the LCC community.

me as a result of watching my community go through the fires and then
water shortages of last year," said Allington. "In particular, I was directly
involved with the evacuation of domestic homeless animals, lost animals, and animals left behind. Every
day I watched the skies and I watched
the people. As the skies got darker,

the people got stronger. We are a community always looking towards the light."

Alex's father also sculpted and he was surrounded by artists at an early age. Alex grew up exploring the mesas and forests of northern New Mexico, painting its land-scapes and showing them in local galleries by age 13. Alex attended Virginia Commonwealth University and graduated with a computer animation degree from The School of Communication Arts in Raleigh, NC.

Alex honed a career for himself in video game development as a digital artist across the country. However, the wonders of the land of enchantment called him home where he now resides in Las Vegas. the New Mexico Higher Education Department. The NMHED mental and behavioral health initiative funded the Building Rough Rider Resilience grant in June 2022. The Feeding Rough Rider Success grant is part of New Mexico's governor Michelle Lujan Grisham's College Food Security initiative.
