H120 - CPR for Health Professionals – IN PERSON 1 CR

Section 16 Days -- T-R--

Times 5:30PM - 6:50PM Bldg Allied Health Center, Room NO16

This course teaches one- and two-rescuer CPR, AED, Foreign Body Airway Obstruction and barrier devices for adults, children and infants. This course is recommended for persons working in a health care setting and those who need a health care provider course for employment (Nursing, EMT, Lifeguards)

BIOL1140 - Biology for Health Sciences **DISTANCE LEARNING** 3 CR

Section 99 Days Async

An introductory course for students interested in health science careers. Focuses on the concepts of chemistry, cell biology, metabolism, genetics, and regulation of gene expression. Pre-requisites: ENG098 or equivalent placement scores.

BIOL1140LE - Biology for Health Sciences Lab (corequisite 1 CR

Section 98 Days Async

A laboratory that complements the concepts learned in the theory course. Students learn skills involved in scientific measurement, microscopy, and mathematical analysis. Students perform experiments and data analysis related to cell structure and function, chemistry, enzyme activity, and genetics. Pre-requisites: ENG098 or equivalent placement scores.

HLED1130E - Concepts of Health & Wellness **DISTANCE LEARNING** 3 CR

Section 98 Days Async

Introduces the student to the "Seven Dimensions of Wellness" (physical, emotional, intellectual, interpersonal, spiritual, environmental, and financial). This course addresses topics including fitness, exercise, nutrition, stress management and chronic lifestyle-related diseases.

PSYC2120 - Developmental Psychology **DISTANCE LEARNING** 3 CR

Congratulations to Luna baseball players Diego Quinonez, Ashton Luera, Kohle Kerin and Jose Villalobos who have all earned Region 9 pitcher or player-of-the-week recognition since the first week of the season.

Quinonez is majoring in liberal arts; Luera is majoring in criminal justice; Kerin is majoring in business and Villlalobos is majoring in preengineering. Below is information on their accomplishments. After the first week of conference play, the Rough Riders were tied for the lead in the Region 9 North Baseball standings with a 2-1 record. They are currently 3-4 in conference.
