Luna's Joseph Baca Jr. selected to participate in art exhibition

Luna Community College student Joseph Baca Jr. has been selected to participate in Eastern New Mexico University's Juried Art Exhibition on Thursday, March 21 in Portales. Baca Jr., a student in Luna's Dr. Bernadette Maldonado's art classes, turned in a 14 by four inch shell stone piece of art called "How's Your Aspen."

The piece of art is done with non-toxic acrylic paint and accented with copper wire and copper tape. It depicts the trunks of Aspen trees with different colors in the background.

"It's an honor," says Baca Jr. "It's a big acknowledgement and I'm thrilled and excited to go."

Baca Jr.'s art along with other entries are taking place in Eastern New Mexico's Runnels Gallery from Feb. 20 to March 21.

"I do not know how many students were chosen but I do know that we were the only community college invited," says

Please use your Luna email to set up ATI account.

On the day of your exam, please **arrive 10 minutes early*** to log in and purchase the exam. The cost of the exam is \$70. You will need to bring a debit/credit card to purchase the exam and a photo ID for identification verification. **No food or drinks** are permitted in the testing site. A calculator is available in ATI and the proctor will provide paper and pencils for use during the exam. All materials will be collected by the proctor before you leave the exam site.

Luna's Angelica Ortiz leading the nation in home runs, RBI's

It's early in the season and Luna Community College softball player Angelica Ortiz is making a name for herself at the National Junior College Athletic Association level. Ortiz, a sophomore from Albuquerque, is leading the nation in home runs with eight and RBI's with 31.

"I put my faith in God and trust Him," said Ortiz recently about her early season play. "I put a lot into softball; as a student-athlete I have to figure out how to get the extra work in. I try my best every day."

Ortiz is one of two Luna softball players to earn honorable mention all-region last season.

"I ask our players to pay attention to two important numbers, batting average and RBI's," said Luna softball coach Randy Krutsch. "Angelica obviously listened. She is doing things she is supposed to be doing. She is a positive leader and a great studentathlete. We're happy to have her on the team."

Ortiz plays catcher and third base for the Lady Rough Riders.

"My success would be nothing without my teammates," says Ortiz. "I love my teammates; I look to them when I'm struggling. They are a big part of my success."

Elisha Velasquez, a sophomore from Albuquerque, is tied for ninth in the nation in home runs with three.

Krutsch said that both Ortiz and Velasquez have received several offers from four-year universities to continue their softball careers.

The Lady Rough Riders are 2-8 on the season. They have played a tough early season schedule.

"We're competing; I'm pleased with the progress," says Krutsch.

The Lady Rough Riders play Frank Phillips College in a home opener on Friday, Feb. 9. The scheduled double header begins at noon at Rodriguez Park.

The Luna baseball team (0-8) travel to Pima College in Arizona over the weekend. The Rough Riders have lost four games to Eastern Arizona and four games to New Mexico Military Institute.

"The guys are working hard; we're knocking on the door to win," says Luna first year baseball coach Erick Wright. "If we correct a couple of things we should be okay."
