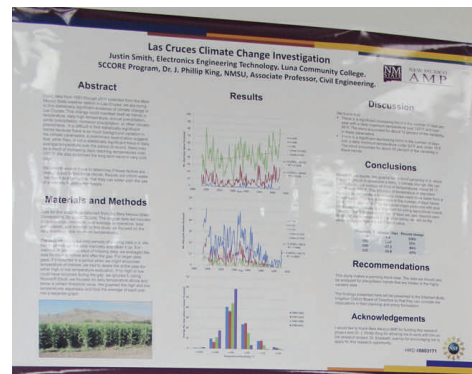
A Halloween costume contest is set from noon to 1 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 31 at the Rough Rider Grill. There is no admission fee for this event.
