Luna Community College student elections set for Sept. 9-11

Voting will culminate from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 11 at Elaine Montano's office in the Luna Community College Allied Health Building.

All newly elected officers and senators will be sworn in at a meeting the week following elections.
