One-on-one with LCC's Elaine Ortega

The following is an interview with LCC School of Business Instructor Elaine Ortega

Tell us about your professional experience and educational background.

I have extremely enjoyed teaching at Luna Community College, but most importantly I have enjoyed working with students. My experience here has been fabulous! Regarding my educational background, I received my MBA in 1995, with an emphasis in management, and my undergraduate degree in MIS-Management Information Systems. I've earned an AAS in computer programming, and numerous certificates including in business ethics and education and organizational best practices from UNM. I continue my professional development plan by taking courses to enhance my profession.

Describe your teaching style or teaching philosophy.

My teaching style is quite unique, first of all; I don't trick students. My courses are very standard where students know what is due on a weekly basis. Students online usually work a lot with essay questions relating to their chapters; this in itself helps students with their writing skills, collect their thoughts, and check their grammar usage. Students online take exams frequently to ensure they have read and understood the material. They also work on projects which are due for finals in utilizing their skills learned throughout the semester.

As a business management faculty member, I believe my role in the classroom environment and online courses allow me to be a facilitator in providing students with information on new business concepts in the field of business. I like to challenge the students by encouraging them to participate in classroom discussion and/or online allowing them to express their opinions on the issues presented bringing and sharing their ideas with other students. In business management courses, I like to have students participate on a final project and incorporate concepts learned throughout the semester. However, if it's a computer class, I encourage students to produce hands-on projects covering both theory and application and

justify that learning took place.

I am highly dedicated to bringing technology to the classroom or online by engaging students to log on with tools the publishing company provides in reinforcing concepts learned with chapter material. I believe this is evident in my integration of technology in all my classes. In order to increase the marketability of our students in the business environment and prepare them for the workplace, they must be exposed to and taught the latest technology (computer and related software) in adopting newer versions of both textbooks and software. Students are engaged in research online, essays (reinforce their writing skills), end-of-chapter questions, terminology presented, videos, you-tube, case scenarios, and project presentations. As with the Internet today; it provides a great deal of research material, enhances the communication process, and provides vast information as a

tool for students; therefore, I have designed projects that require Internet usage and comprehension.

In addition, I have periodically invited guest speakers from the local community to visit various classes to share their small business successes, experiences, and expertise with the students. I have also invited professors from UNM to speak with students regarding the importance of business ethics. My goal is to provide the learning experience that will enable the student to have the opportunity to effectively compete and excel in the global business environment. I truly enjoy working with students!

What is your favorite part of your current job and why is it your favorite part?

Again, my favorite part of my job is working with students. I enjoy what I do which is extremely important in working at any job. I also have the opportunity myself to stay current in my field. Currently, I am taking a graduate level course at NMHU (The Evolution of Management Thought), and as a participant earning a certification in business ethics from UNM. In addition, I will be attending

a workshop this April. I will also take a continuing education class at the Santa Fe Community College in April. The learning process continues to instill new ventures in our everyday lives. "I welcome knowledge"!

What is one or two of your proudest professional accomplishments?

I am so proud of myself in earning my MBA. I struggled with obtaining an education because I lost both my parents during the process. It's amazing how we can overcome obstacles in life which just make us stronger at what we accomplish. I'm quite fortunate to have been given the opportunity to work with students and contribute to their pathway of success.

How does your background and experiences strengthen academics at LCC?

I have worked with Luna Community College as a business instructor for approximately 16 years, which has contributed, strengthened, and improved my method of instruction in providing quality education to students in the School of Business. I strongly believe that continuous improvement is an ongoing effort to improve learning of instruction.
