Two hundred dollars and a welding machine—that's all this 23 year old young man from Trujillo had to start a business. Yes I remember like it was yesterday-the day I came home from a good paying, stable job as a welder and told my newlywed wife from Garita of two years (who happened to be eight months pregnant) "I quit my job"! "Why would you do that," was her heated response. I said, "to start my own business." From that moment on I never looked back. I took the side jobs I did at night and on weekends after working 50-60 hours at my welding job, and turned that into enough work for my first three employees that I hired 41 years

LCC receives Piñon award from Quality NM; Montoya to serve on QNM Board of Directors

Luna Community College was one of eight entities and the only institution of higher learning to receive a Piñon Performance Excellent Award at the 2014 Quality New Mexico Learning Summit and New Mexico Performance Excellence Awards Ceremony recently in Albuquerque.

It is the second consecutive year that LCC received a Piñon Award.

Quality New Mexico is non-profit organization that engages in activities which seek to educate New Mexicans about quality and encourage and reward quality in business, education and other sectors.

Gov. Susana Martinez was on –hand and presented the award to LCC Board Chairman Abelino Montoya Jr. and STEM faculty Betsy Sanchez and Nichole Collins.

"It's a tribute to our administration and staff that they are taking on another level of quality process through the Baldridge system," said Montoya Jr. who spoke at the event. "This adds a little more work, but the results will be tremendous for the school. The entire country's educational system is falling into the Baldridge plan and Luna Community College has taken these great steps."

Montoya Jr. will be serving on the Quality New Mexico Board of Directors effective June 1.

Since 1994 the New Mexico Performance Excellence Awards Program has recognized businesses and organizations on their "Path to Performance Excellence". The 'Path' is a formal improvement journey for any sector organization. The Program provides New Mexico with three levels of organizational assessment, written feedback with strengths and opportunities for continued improvement, and public recognition.

By earning the Piñon Award for the second time, Luna Community College has shown that it is identifying and using systematic processes and collecting data to reflect early results in areas of most importance. In addition, Luna Community College has described its approaches for and deployment of its key operational processes. It has also identified its evaluation and improvement activities or processes, and has shown coordination among organizational units.

Alta Vista Regional Hospital received the Compañero Award at the Quality New Mexico Conference for its continued mentoring and hands-on education that it provides to the college's nursing students.

New Mexico's quality initiative started in 1991 and the quality awards program has been ongoing for over 20 years. Quality New Mexico's mission is to drive performance excellence in New Mexico organizations by providing role models, tools, knowledge, learning experiences and best practices.

The college will now strive to reach the Roadrunner level where it has to demonstrate the commitment and implementation of quality principles and show substantive progress in building sound and systematic processes.

LCC Board Member David Gutierrez speaks on tuition

The following was written by Luna Community College Board Member David Gutierrez. Mr. Gutierrez is the chairman of the Education Committee.

I would like to highlight my position on tuition increase. Honestly, I'm not trying to

advocate the increase at this particular moment. My intents are to gather information and see if it would be feasible at this time to increase the tuition slightly as well as implementing lab fees that would sustain many of our Title V licenses as well as many of the vocational labs, nursing, dental and cosmetology departments.

Here are some of my points about the situation: (1) Affordability—community colleges remain the most affordable sector of higher education with minimal or no debt for objectives that build self direction and self

students. However, tuition and fees at community colleges are largely outside of the institution's control, as state and local funding cuts have escalated these costs 29 percent in just five years. In order to gain a more accurate picture of affordability rat-

> ings, we should also evaluate student loan debts based on the median debt load of all competitors at an institution.

(2) Online courses need to be built with

motivation. We have to think about all the different pathways the students on campus are seeking, such as blended learning or massive open online courses. But the ecosystem we create and how technology fits into the picture falls back on funding. This is one

reason I feel we need to at least implement a technology fee that would sustain the way we provide instruction and teach today's students.

I also understand that the economy here in northeastern New Mexico is at a low point, but if a student is really interested in obtaining an education they will find the means to pay for their educa-

tion. In all respect, I would appreciate feedback with some rhyme or reason to increase or not.

Remembering Maria Maria Helena Flores Paiz, Executive Office Manager, Luna Community College

Six years ago Maria and I began our professional journey together in the Office of the President at Luna Community College. When I arrived, Maria was already a keenly knowledgeable and experienced executive office manager who had served with several past presidents. She also served as the Board of Trustees office contact and official meeting coordinator, provider of institutional knowledge, and transcriber. These duties among others required great responsibility and efficiency. Maria always provided expeditious, accurate and professional responses to Trustees, Presidents, faculty, staff, students, community members and national, state, and local dignitaries.

Maria's daily schedule was never the same. She would: arrive at work carrying her shoulder briefcase filled with LCC paperwork, wish everyone a good morning, settle in behind her desk, remove her confidential documents from her shoulder briefcase, turn on her computer and begin the day. Within minutes after setting up for the day, there were phone messages and e-mails to review and listen to and then respond to; students, staff, and community members would immediately come in posing questions to Maria about how to process paperwork, where to find an instructor and asking to set-up a meeting with the President.

That was usually how the first 30 minutes of the day got started. Then the unexpected would follow, someone needed information quickly, a community member needed to be accommodated as soon as possible, and the phone calls began – they were usually

people wanting their issues addressed as soon as possible. Regardless of the combination of activities flowing through the President's office, Maria always had a way of multi-tasking and meeting the needs of those who relied on her because she provided a positive and professional demeanor, steady confidence, accurate responses, and a real can-do attitude that was at the base of requests. People relied on and liked the way Maria took care of business.

As the day wore on, Maria scheduled more meetings, more issues requiring attention were addressed, and the fast clatter of the keys on her computer keyboard seemed to turn into a harmony of symphonic music. Still the phone would ring, people would stop by her desk and say, Maria, I need a signature from the President - can you get it for me? Sure enough, Maria would carefully review the documentation, if the paperwork was in order, she would use her know how to secure the signature, and get people on their way so they would calmly, assuredly, and successfully complete their task.

Then, 5 p.m. would come, most employees were packing up for the day and saying goodbye to Maria. She would respond; I hope you have a good night, see you tomorrow. While others were headed home to their families, Maria was preparing to get to the work she needed to finish that day. You see, during the day, she was taking care of the needs of others and leaving her work until the needs of others had been met. That's how unselfish Maria was. She never complained, kept on task, and sometime during the evening finished her work for the day.

But it didn't end there. That was the everyday unexpected work! There was so much of her work that was confidential in nature. It dealt with reviewing documents for approval by the President (she was working on her own time to finish certification as a legal assistant); coordinating the Reaffirmation for Accreditation self-study to post on the WEB, and ensuring the paperwork essential to the successful operation of LCC was meticulously completed. **Continued on next page**
