"Luna has helped me a lot," said Gallegos "With SkillsUSA I have a family at school. Someday I hope to finish school and get my own home."

Terri Stafford also took a silver medal. Stafford competed in commercial baking.

"I am really happy with my performance," said Stafford. "I have a good advisor that provided me a lot of encouragement. Their was a lot of trial and error. There were a lot of things in the competition that we learned in class."

"For it being my first year here it was a good experience," said Gonzales. "It went really well."
