ACE Lab available to students

The Academic Center for Excellence (ACE), commonly called the ACE lab is located in the Tech building on the Luna Community College campus and provides computer access, tutoring for STEM courses, as well as information on internships, scholarships and research opportunities in the sciences. The center is in the heart of the STEM department and casual student-instructor interaction in this environment is frequent and makes for a productive study environment.

We welcome all students of the LCC community; you do not need to be a STEM major to visit the ACE Lab! In addition to traditional access to tutors, the center follows the unique Supplemental Instructor (SI) Model developed by Dr. Deanna Martin in 1973 at the University of Missouri at Kansas City. This model has proven to increase student performance and retention. SI targets traditionally difficult academic courses and provides regularly scheduled, out-of-class, peer facilitated sessions.

The SI sessions are facilitated by Supplemental Instruction Leaders (SILs), who are LCC or NMHU consortium students and have mastered the course, done well, and been identified by faculty as model students to act as SILs. Each SIL sits in a targeted course, take notes and establishes a peer relationship with the students in the classroom. The SIL's participate in scheduled trainings led by the SI supervisor, to increase the quality of the sessions.

SI sessions are regularly scheduled outside the class and held at the ACE lab. They integrate how-to-learn with what-to-learn.

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Congratulations to the three Luna Community College first level nursing recipients of the Alta Vista Regional Hospital Auxiliary Scholarship: Pictured (I-r) are Kiana Gutierrez, Kimberly Sena and Kacy Cochran. Students who participate in SI sessions discover study strategies, e.g. note taking, graphic organization, questioning techniques, vocabulary acquisition, and test preparation, as they review content material. This spring semester the following STEM courses have SIL's:

These sessions are open to all students in these subject areas and are attended on a voluntary base. It has been shown that students who participate in SI sessions earn higher subject grades and withdraw less often than non-SI participants.

The pageant proved to be a huge



You may be able to get Medicaid if:

Children can get enrolled now. Adults can apply as soon as **October 1, 2013** for coverage that starts January 1, 2014:

- * At an ISD office near you
- * Online from a computer
- * By phone, fax, or mail
- * In-person at community agencies, hospitals and clinics across the state

Call Medicaid at 1-855-637-6574 or visit www.hsd.state.nm.us/isd/apply.html.

Simple and easy! Medicaid will look for your records from government agencies so you do not need to prove things like citizenship or immigration status unless your records cannot be found. You may have to prove income. If you or your family members cannot get proof of employment, you can sign a statement declaring your income.

Apply before March 31, 2014. If you don't qualify for Medicaid, you can apply for financial help to get coverage in a new Health Insurance Exchange, but you must enroll by March 31st!

Native Americans can apply anytime.
