One-on-one with LCC's Betsy Sanchez

The following is an interview with Luna Community College instructor Betsy Sanchez.

Tell us about your professional experience and educational background.

I am a proud alumni from Luna Community College, where I received my associate's degree in office administration. This allowed me to work at New Mexico Highlands University as an administrative assistant in the financial aid office where I enjoyed helping students. I then completed my bachelor's degree in education where I could be able to teach in the public school system. I enjoyed teaching at West Las Vegas Middle School with teenagers; it was a challenge. This made me like teaching even more. I then applied to teach a few classes here at LCC in the STEM Department. The students here motivated me to continue my education to earn my master's degree in instruction and curriculum in mathematics.

Describe your teaching style or teaching philosophy. My style of teaching is student-

What are one or two of your proudest professional accomplishments?

The first of my proudest professional moments was earning my master's degree. My other proudest moments have been watching my three oldest children and our students walk the line for graduation and knowing that I helped them achieve a one of hopefully many of their educational goals in their life.

How does your background and experiences strengthen academics at LCC?

I was a non-traditional student myself when I returned to college. I
