**Major General Kenny Montoya**

Major General Montoya served in several leadership and staff positions in each rank. Until September 11, 2001, he served as a traditional guardsman and worked as a

senior trial prosecutor in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Judicial District. He was selected and appointed as the Adjutant General for the New Mexico National Guard in March, 2003 and held this position until April 2012. During this time New Mexico Guardsmen and women distinguished themselves in numerous deployments to Iraq, Afghanistan, Kuwait, Qatar, Cuba, Kosovo, Egypt and Columbia.

At the same time the New Mexico Guard helped in hurricanes Katrina and Rita and numerous fires, snowstorms, and rescues here at home. His education includes a BA from Parks College, MA from the U.S. Army war College in Strategic Studies, an LLM from the Judge Advocates School, and a JD from UNM School of Law. He has recently opened a private law practice in Albuquerque.

# Lawrence Quintana: participation in decision process critical to LCC

*This is the fourth in a series of interviews with department leaders at Luna Community College. The following interview is with Human Resources Director Lawrence Quintana.*

**What departments do you oversee?**

**What is each department's responsibility?**

I oversee the functions of the Human Resources Department, which consist of Payroll, Benefits, and Human Resources functions. In addition, I provide support for the Information Technology Department which has an assigned director. I would dearly like him to have the opportunity to provide his leadership style and provide his vision regarding his department, therefore, I will refrain from discussing the IT Department and suggest you conduct this interview with the IT Leadership.

**How long have you worked at LCC? In what capacity?**

I was hired in 2005 as the Human Resources Director.

**What is a typical day like?**

A typical day consists of meeting with HR staff informally and validating what objectives will be worked on, or are being worked on. Additional discussion takes place if there are new or pressing issues. Typically there are several meetings scheduled. Between scheduled meetings informal meetings with employees arise on a consistent basis. Informal meeting with Directors, faculty, and support staff consist of providing answers to general questions, listen to employee needs, and frequently allow employees an opportunity to vent. Provide leadership at all levels with feedback. Other tasks that are worked on continually are the scheduling of postings, interviews, and communication on these actions. Further information can be described in the next question.

**What are your primary duties?**

The evolving role of the human resources professional is in many instances misunderstood. The HR professional works to ensure that the effective and efficient use of human talents are accessible and available to meet the needs of the college. The HR Director's role is built upon a foundation of advice, service, and controls. The advice portion of the job is to gather facts, diagnosing of problems, providing suggested solutions, offering objective assistance, and guidance on employee related issues. Service is related to a diverse customer student base, but also including upper management, educational management, support leadership, support staff, peers, departments, legal and regulatory agencies, vendors, applicants, retirees, and employee families.



**Lawrence Quintana has been human resource director at LCC since 2005.**

Controls deal with measuring employee performance, evaluating supervisor performance, correcting deficiencies and assisting leadership in the motivation of employees. Another part of my job is to work with other leaders in the college to address the strategic, organizational, and administrative needs of the college. This, however, requires that other leaders are knowledgeable in conducting these components in the college. Finally, I collaborate with the executive committee consisting of three trustees dedicated to information, development and forecasting of human talent policies, and needs, which are taken to the remaining board for consideration.

**Where do you see yourself and your department in five years?**

First I would like to state the short term issues I would like to see addressed at LCC. Shared governance which theoretically consists of a faculty senate. Participation in the decision process from all stakeholders is critical and will help improve the educational products of this institution.

**What is the best part of your job?**

The best part of my job is working with leaders, faculty, and support staff who are able to discuss positive transformational ideas. This includes discussions about issues with real solutions, with concrete facts, and discussions which are focused on the mission of education.

**What is the toughest part of your job?**

The toughest part of the human resources job is transactional thinking. Results are based on individual needs instead of student and institutional needs.

**Where do you see opportunities to grow?**

Don Peck who wrote the book titled "Pinched" a book published in 2011 stated that "Career-Academy programs should be expanded, as should apprenticeship programs (often affiliated with community colleges) and other, similar programs designed to build an ethic of hard work; to allow young people to develop skills and make achievements out-side the traditional classroom as well as inside it; and ultimately to provide more, clearer pathways into real careers." The service industry, technology oriented jobs, and medical fields are in the largest demand during this recession. Opportunity will exist if we expand opportunities for internship and apprenticeships in our service areas. Working with external partners and the community will result in opportunity.

## What is on your bucket list?

First, I would like to say that working at LCC continues to be a pleasure. This college has so many talented people who are here for the right reasons. My bucket list consists of the following:

Work with faculty to develop a faculty handbook that provides them with a document in which they are the primary architects of its framework. Work with president, executive committee, and Board of Trustees on a vision for the college in which all students, faculty, and support staff can work on students and their success.

## What are some of the successes and visions of the department you oversee?

The successes which have been achieved by the HR Department consist of the following:

Leticia Archuleta, payroll manager has reduced the amount of payroll which is mailed out to employees. By increasing the amount of employees who receive direct deposit and providing access to electronic pay stubs, Ms. Archuleta has reduced the amount of documents mailed out each month.

HR Staff have alternated lunches to provide access to employees to the HR Department from 8-5, rarely is the HR Office closed

for lunch.

One of the goals HR Department has worked collaboratively with leaders in the college is performance management tools.

Maria Sena, HR Technician has ensured that hiring processes which are authentic and provides applicants with equal consideration through a systematic process.

Training: The HR Department has provided training on institutional culture, sexual harassment, performance management, and institution policies and procedures, to employees which provides students and employees with a work and learning environment which is healthy.

Sandra Rivera, office manager prepares for the monthly executive committee meetings, and provides accurate minutes each and every month.

## What is the overall budget your department works with and how much does it receive?

The current budget is approximately \$213,029.45 a reduction of about \$30,000 over the past three years. This has been accomplished through budget comparison on actuals, and budget validation based on per cost determinations.

## Your department recently got audited. How did that go?

The HR Department received a clean audit for 2010-2011 fiscal year. This can be attributed to the pre-audit conducted by the HR staff and through the processes and procedures that have been implemented by the HR Department.

## Is there anything you would like to say to the students and staff at LCC?

This institution is here to provide students with an education which is built on a foundation of success. Frank Springer stated the following in 1899: "I know that in education, as well as in all things else, we must crawl before we walk. Nevertheless in all youth there is a hope and expectation of maturity; and unless we set our mark well ahead, and plan and speculate upon conditions and achievements beyond what are immediately in sight, the world's advancement would be slow indeed." Every student, community member, board of trustee, administrator, faculty member, and staff person needs to look ahead and set goals which plan what students will need in order to be successful. The world is changing every day and what works today, may not meet the needs of students tomorrow. Therefore, we must work together to prepare for the future needs of our students and community.
