Construction set to begin soon!

The Luna Community College Auto Collision Building has been the main focus for Year 2 and many meetings have transpired in the past five months with the architect to plan the construction. The plan is to finish out the roughed-in "shell" of the auto collision building and move the program into that facility by the 2014-15 academic school year. The plan will bring the existing automotive building up to code, improve energy efficiency, and provide space for required equipment that has been ordered and is currently in storage at the warehouse. The other piece of the auto collision initiative is to update the curricula to incorporate equipment required for students to achieve required competencies. This will enable the program to obtain national NATEF accreditation.



Internal meetings have also taken place with the Title V staff and LCC Vocational Director Gary Martinez to collaboratively order auto repair equipment, shadow boards, tools, a paint booth and a prep station. These items will enhance the Auto Collision Department in providing state-of-art equipment for students enrolled in all classes. Together with the Title V and G.O. Bond monies, the Auto Collision Program will be a great program at Luna Community College.
