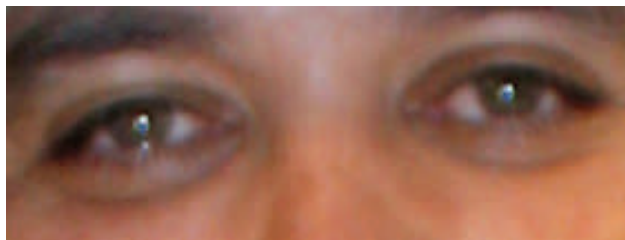
What do you like least about LCC and what would you offer as a solution?

Moses Marquez: There are a lot of factors that make recruiting successful

The following is an interview with LCC Interim Director of Admissions and Recruiting Moses Marquez.

How is recruiting going this semester? It has been a busy semester with career/college fairs, tours and also had a LCC caravan of speakers that spoke to high school students about programs at LCC. We have also had to deal with some negative press that seems to remain in peoples mind.

What are some factors that go into a successful recruiting year? There are a lot of factors that make recruitment successful; a survey was done by The National Center for Education Statistics that shows the top five recruiting strategies for attracting high school students to your college are 1. Campus visits. 2. Information about major. 3. Web site 4. High school visits by college recruiter. 5. College catalogs and view-book. We take part in four of these factors. We help students navigate the web site.

What could you do to gain more support from the administration, faculty and staff in your recruiting efforts? It has been disappointing with the support that we have received during our campus tours and the caravan of speakers; we would have liked to have every department represented in these efforts. We have also been criticized because we give tours to middle and elementary students, but this is the best time to plant higher education in their minds. We have also been criticized because we have late campus tours but this is due to the tour getting a free meal at NMHU and then coming to LCC after their free meal.

How has recruiting changed over the last 5 to 10 years? Recruiting has changed a lot. We don't have as much access to the student like we used to, and most schools only allow a certain number of times a college may recruit at their school.

What is the biggest selling point for Luna Community College? Our biggest selling point has to be our personal attention, quality education and low tuition.

What are some of the obstacles you face in recruiting? We face a lot of obstacles such as the lack of technology that we need in the recruitment and admissions CARS system. Rejection and restriction of travel to schools or

fairs. Negative press whether warranted or unwarranted. Our dwindling population in our service areas.

What are your plans for the rest of the summer?

We will be setting up our recruitment booth all around in our service areas, we have some campus tours set up, follow up on prospective students and get ready for fall recruitment. We hope to recruit the entire state.

How do you think the community views Luna Community College?

I think we are viewed as just like other community colleges are viewed. No respect. But I think President Obama plans will change some mindsets, he proposed sinking nearly \$12 billion into revamping the country's community college system. The plan would provide \$9 billion in grant money to boost academic programs and raise graduation rates, plus

another \$2.5 billion to upgrade school facilities. It would also fund open-source online courses so that schools don't have to build more classrooms. I was at a conference once and one speaker said if the university system is an ocean liner, community colleges are the speedboats of higher education. If they get more money and use it wisely, the thinking goes; they can produce results in a matter of years. After all, they're designed to respond to the needs of the local community. That's what Luna Community College needs to do is respond to the needs of our communities.

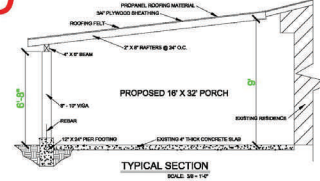

How do I apply?

The **first step** in applying for the SAAI Program is to fill out an application at the LCC Dual-Credit Office located within the Technologies Building in Room TE-144.

The **second step** is to complete the LCC COMPASS Assessment with the LCC ACCESS Center in the Student Services Building if COMPASS has not yet been completed or student has not taken the ACT.

The **third step** is to bring in a copy of your LCC COMPASS Assessment or recent copy of ACT scores and meet with LCC Dual-Credit staff to complete career cluster survey and advisement.

Each student who is accepted in the SAAI Program will receive an Educational Care Package (ECP) that includes:

- Book Fee Waiver
 - \$150 Stipend
 - Each student will be assigned to a College Success Mentor.

Summer extracurricular activities will also be available for students participating in the SAAI Program.
