

In a joint effort, West Las Vegas teacher Kirk Ludi and his students along with LCC students were involved in the process on how to build an electric car. In this case, the students used a 1970 Porsche 914. It uses six twelve volt batteries (72 volts) to power the car between 60-80 miles and the car is capable of going 60-80 mph. It takes anywhere from 8-12 hours to charge the depleted batteries. In this class, 25 students from WLVHS and between 20 to 30 students from LCC were involved.
