#### Water Boiling Advisory for Las Vegas

## AVISO PRECAUTORIO DE HERVIR EL AGUA Para el Sistema de Agua de la Ciudad de Las Vegas, NM HIERVA EL AGUA ANTES DE USARLA

Debido a la baja presión o interrupción del suministro de agua que está ocurriendo actualmente, el Sistema de Agua de la Ciudad de Las Vegas recomienda a sus consumidores hervir el agua antes de consumirla.

La presión extremadamente baja o la falta de presión, como las que ocumen durante una interrupción del suministro de agua, pueden aumentar la probabilidad de contaminación microbiológica dentro del sistema de distribución. Aunque no se ha detectado contaminación como resultado de esta interrupción, se recomienda a los clientes del Sistema de Agua de la Ciudad de Las Vegas que hiervan el agua hasta nuevo aviso.

#### ¿Qué debo hacer? ¿Qué significa esto?

- NO BEBA EL AGUA SIN HERVIRLA PRIMERO. - Aunque no se ha detectado contaminación en el Sistema de Agua de la Ciudad de Las Vegas, la presencia de coliformes fecales y E. coli indica que el agua podría estar contaminada con desechos humanos o animales. Los microbios en estos desechos pueden causar diarrea, calambres, náuseas, dolores de cabeza u otros sintomas. Pueden representar un riesgo especial para bebés, niños pequeños y personas con sistemas inmunológicos comprometidos.

#### PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER ADVISORY

#### For the City of Las Vegas, NM Water System

#### BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Due to the low pressure/outage that is currently occurring, the City of Las Vegas Water System is advising its water consumers to boil water prior to consuming.

Extreme low pressure or no pressure occurrences such as those experienced during a water outage may increase the likelihood of microbiological contamination within the distribution system. Although no contamination has currently been detected as a result of this water outage, customers of City of Las Vegas Water System are still encouraged to boil their water until further notice.

#### What should I do? What does this mean?

- DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil
  for one minute before drinking, cooking, washing fruits and vegetables, feeding a baby,
  brushing teeth, preparing drinks, making ice, and providing drinking water for pets. More

- Although no contamination has currently been detected in the City of Las Vegas
   Water System, "Fecal coli forms and E. coli are bacteria whose presence indicates that
   the water may be contaminated with human or animal wastes. Microbes in these wastes
   can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms. They may pose a
   special health risk for infants, young children, and people with severely compromised
   immune systems."
- The symptoms above are not caused only by organisms in drinking water. If you
  experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical
  advice. People at increased risk should seek advice from their health care providers
  about drinking this water.

#### What is being done?

We have placed this precautionary boil in place to support our water system as we work through necessary maintenance. When repairs are made to the water system, we will conduct special monitoring to ensure that the system is free of microbial contamination. In addition, we will inform you when you no longer need to boil your water as necessary.

#### Scholarship Guidelines & Process

Who We Are: The Luna Community College Foundation is a private 501(c)(3) organization formed for the purpose of assisting Luna Community College (LCC) in performing its mission of providing training and education for careers in technical and vocational fields for post-secondary students. That assistance may be accomplished in a variety of ways including support programs, financial assistance to students, financial assistance for LCC programs, physical plant enhancement, assistance in continuing educational opportunities for LCC administrative and instructional staff and the establishment and implementation of programs corollary to LCC instructional programs which augment and enhance the educational opportunities of LCC students.

The Luna Community College Foundation generates funding from private donors, fundraising activities, corporate grants, & employee contributions.

Who is Eligible: Any student, in good academic standing (GPA 2.0+) who is actively enrolled at LCC (main campus or satellites) either on a part-time or full-time basis in any program affiliated with the college.

Financial Need: Financial need is the general requirement for all LCC Foundation Scholarships. Priority will be placed with student applicants who have a financial hardship that may prevent a student from attending or continuing an educational endeavor at LCC, this includes the inability of a student to purchase textbooks, supplies or other curriculum requirements essential for the courses for which they are enrolled.

Application Process: One application per student, per semester is allowed. This application must be submitted together with a copy of the students' current transcript and completed essay questions prior to the deadlines outlined herein.

Limitations: The LCC Foundation Scholarships cannot be awarded in arrears to pay for previous semester costs. Unless otherwise indicated, scholarships are limited to cost of attendance as listed on the LCC Award Letter.

Please submit your completed application with the required documentation to the Luna Community College Foundation office, located on the 2nd floor of the Student Services building, or submit by email to: locfoundation@luna.edu

The LCC Foundation Scholarship Coordinator will present all applicants' required documentation to the Foundation Scholarship Committee for review, discussion, and final action. Once finalized, applicants will be notified by the LCC Foundation Scholarship Coordinator as to status and outcome of this application.

Scholarship Disbursement: Once a scholarship has been approved, the Foundation Scholarship Coordinator will initiate the process to fund the student's account at LCC with the award monies.



- Deadline to order your regalia (cap and gown) Friday, March 28, 2025 with the LCC Bookstore see attached flier for details
- Deadline to apply to graduate SPRING GRADUATES ONLY Monday, March 10, 2025 by 5pm MST- submit Application for Degree and pay the one-time graduation fee of \$15.00 per degree or certificate. (attached)

ALL STUDENTS PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO INDICATE ON YOUR APPLICATION FOR DEGREE YES OR NO, IF YOU WILL BE WALKING FOR THE SPRING 2025 COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY.

Students will receive their Final Degree Check clearing them for their degree via your LCC Student Email to include your eligibility for graduation honors. All students who are eligible for honors will be able to purchase the honor cord with your regalia order at the Bookstore who will have a list of students who qualify.


