Certificate

The Certificate in Emergency Medical Technician - Basic prepares individuals to sit for National Registry EMT certification exam.

Prerequisite/Corequisite: Students need to take **AH120** CPR for Health Professionals or hold a current CPR for Health Professionals certification.

Completion of this certificate can be applied toward the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Allied Health.

Our goal is to continue to offer the EMT training through this program in conjunction with either the University of New Mexico as we have done in the past, or partner with Santa



Fe Community College. The program is certainly an important part of our allied health offerings and it is anticipated that the program will return to serve students in the coming year.
