Winter Storm Warning for Las Vegas: Prepare for Hazardous Weather Conditions
Friday, April 4, 2025 – 8:00 a.m.

Effective from 9 PM Tonight until 6 PM Saturday

A **Winter Storm Warning** is in effect for Las Vegas and surrounding areas. Heavy snow and blowing snow are expected, with total snow accumulations potentially reaching up to 10 inches. Reduced visibility and hazardous travel conditions are likely, especially along U.S. 64/87, U.S. 54, and Interstate 25. Dangerous driving conditions are anticipated due to snow accumulation and icy roads.

In addition, strong winds may bring down tree branches, which could result in power outages. Temperatures are expected to drop well below freezing, adding to the risks.

Travel Advisory:

- Avoid unnecessary travel.
- If travel is essential, carry an extra flashlight, food, and water in your vehicle.
- Stay informed with local news and weather alerts.



Forecast snowfall from Friday through Saturday / Heaviest snow in the northern mountains


There are many factors that can affect snowfall amounts. These experimental graphics show the range of possibilities.

Low End Amount
(90% chance of greater snowfall)



This lower amount is an unlikely scenario with a 9 in 10, or 90% chance that more snow will fall, and only a 1 in 10, or 10% chance that less snow will fall. This will be possible if the storm system is weaker, moves faster, and/or has less moisture than expected.


Expected Snowfall – Official NWS Forecast

(10% chance of greater snowfall)



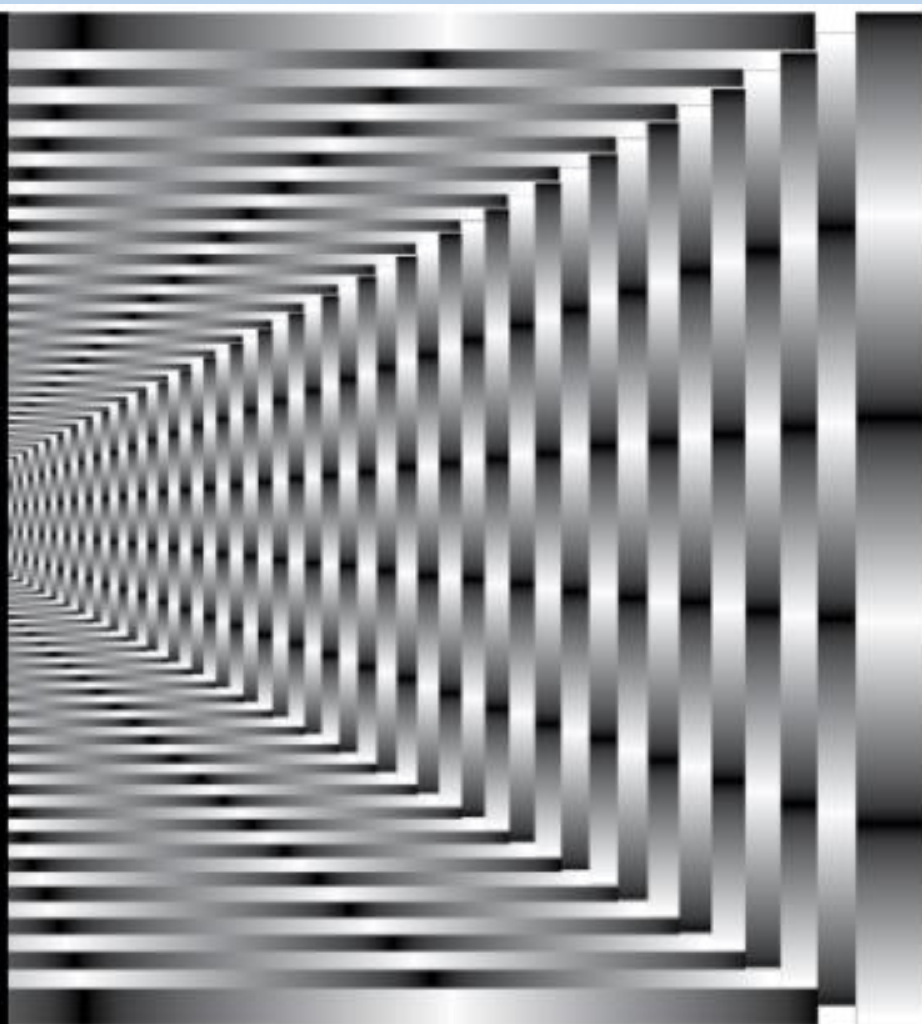

Wildfire Season Preparedness

From the Wildfire Resiliency Training Center

This spring and summer are shaping up to be potentially very active. Dry, warm winter coupled with unusually high spring winds and temperatures as well as low relative humidity all point toward a possible active wildfire season.

There are dozens upon dozens of websites and agency recommendations. Which ones should we follow? Which ones might we question. Here at the WRTC, our recommendations are based upon years of scientific research including laboratory analyses, actual live burn research in the field, hundreds and hundreds of post-fire investigations and measurements, and interviews with homeowners and evacuees.

This research has shown how wildfire behaves, especially in relationship to homes, structures, topography, vegetation and weather. Here are some tips and information to help with your wildfire preparedness:

- Most homes/structures are ignited by embers, not large flames. Harden your home against ember "attack" by covering/screening vents and roof openings, move flammable debris such as leaves and pine needles from wooden decks and stairs. Trim or rake dry/dead vegetation near the structures. This creates a "survivable" space for your home.
- Prepare an evacuation plan. Have items such as documents, medicines, and keepsakes ready to put in your vehicle quickly. Have the same plan for your pets as well!
- When you're preparing to evacuate, close windows, doors garages. Don't worry about removing window treatments or moving furniture away from walls...you don't need to do this.
- Most civilian injuries and accidents in wildfire occur during evacuation. Prepare and leave early. Once in a safe area, then contact family and friends.
- Again, by following these guidelines, you are creating a "survivable" space (one in which your home has a better likelihood of surviving on its own. Creating a "defensible" space infers that responders will move into the path of the fire and defend your home. This is highly unlikely due to life safety and limited resources in active wildfire.
- Preparedness includes some common yard work, cleaning gutters, preventing ember entry and being ready to evacuate promptly.
