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#### <u>Purpose</u>

#### **Conclusion**

The Capstone class began and finished with 21 students. They needed to complete 72 hours of preceptorship and complete 5 modules through ATI to pass the course. Their scores depended on how much of their ATI they completed. Nineteen students received an A and two received a B for the class. All objectives were met.

Next year for this class, we will begin earlier and have finals week without any work to do through ATI. Their ATI work is very intensive and takes a lot of time on the student's behalf. They need to adhere to deadlines through ATI to get their scores. Overall, this part of the course was what kept the two students from getting an A. Also looking at increasing their preceptorship hours to 90 instead of 72 and the ATI will stay the same. The increase in preceptor hours will help our students have more experience to be more prepared when they get into the workforce.
