Transfer Articulation Agreement

Luna Community College
Associate of Arts in General Business Program

Article I - Agreement on Principle

The University of New Mexico and Luna Community College agree that students who begin their studies at the Luna Community College (hereafter, LCC) and transfer to The University New Mexico (hereafter, UNM) to earn a bachelor's degree should experience a smooth transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework. The University of New Mexico and Luna Community College enter into this agreement as cooperating, equal partners who shall maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

Article II - Agreement on Program Specifics

- Specific courses that transfer are listed on the attached Transfer Guide
- At least 30 credits must be completed at UNM.
- The Transfer Guide will be updated regularly to reflect new and discontinued classes and will be available on the UNM and LCC website.
- Courses with less than a "D" grade will not transfer.
- Students are strongly encouraged to complete the degree at Luna Community College. Students who do not complete the Luna Community College AA in General Business Degree will be evaluated for admission to the UNM BBA Program on a case-by-case basis and will be required to complete general education coursework not met at Luna Community College at The University of New Mexico in accordance with the catalog year in effect at the time of transfer.

Article III - Agreement on Communication

The UNM School of Business and Luna Community College agree to cooperate in communication with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the

established relationship between the two institutions. Faculty and staff at both institutions will share the information in this agreement with interested and qualified students and both institutions will provide advising to current and prospective students. Luna Community College students are strongly encouraged to contact both Luna Community College advisors and UNM BBA Program advisors as early as possible to put together a customized program plan for courses at both Luna Community College and UNM.

Article IV - Maintenance and Review Procedures

The University of New Mexico and Luna Community College agree to identify at least one individual at each institution to evaluate the continuing effectiveness of this agreement, to facilitate changes to and development of the program, and to advise students in exceptional situations.

Effective Dates

- This agreement is effective as of <u>June 12, 2023 to End Date June 12, 2031.</u>
- This agreement will be reviewed by UNM and LCC annually.
- This transfer articulation agreement shall not exceed eight (8) years.
