Faculty Senate Regular Meeting Friday, September 26, 2025 1:00-2:00 PM on Google Meet

I. Establishment of Quorum: Present: Mari Hill, Gene Martinez, Kevin Williams, Billie Mathews,

and Nichole Collins Absent: Chantel Rivera and Linda Salazar

- II. Call of Meeting to Order: Chair Mari Hill called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m.
- III. Approval of Agenda: Agenda was presented. Gene Martinez made a motion to approve the agenda. Motion was seconded by Nichole Collins. Motion was approved.
- IV. Approval of Minutes from September 12 Meeting: Minutes of September 12 meeting were presented. Gene Martinez made the motion to approve the minutes. Nichole Collins seconded the motion. Motion was approved.

- VI. Information/Discussion Items:

A. Senator Reports

- Mari Hill (Education Senator, Senate Chair) New Mexico's universal child care
 will be good for early childhood education programs. It is exciting to see
 how it will help us.
- 2. Gene Martinez (CTE Senator, Vice Chair) LANL is encouraging Gene to do some specialty welding certifications and will give him money to buy the material. He is also getting his laser welder. He met with AWS at CNM in Santa Fe and it looks like we will be the only community college that will be doing laser welding, which will be a boost for Luna. He is getting a bunch of new tools. Gene's eye surgeries are complete!
- 3. Kevin Williams (Associates Senator, Secretary) Nothing new to report. Kevin mentioned Dr. Linder's presentation to Shared Governance. She mentioned the Tuition Waiver Policy, and wanting the Senates to look

at

the possibility of a Dress Code Policy. She also wants Luna to look at how we communicate with students and explore options for alerts.

Discussion ensued and the general consensus was that a dress code would have to take into consideration the roles of the individuals (by department), and would work best if it was specific about what is NOT allowed. A policy has the potential to be divisive.

4. Billie Mathews (Humanities Senator, Immediate Past Chair) – Billie Mathews shared the Tuition Waiver information she received from Dr. Linder. It

went out to the Staff and Student Senates, as well. Billie plans on volunteering to research dress codes and share information with Shared Governance. She feels that it is better for us to be proactive about it rather than wait and have a dress code imposed upon us with no input or say. Billie, as a humanities teacher, tends to get a lot of dual credit students. We have a percentage of dual credit students, particularly in asynchronous classes. She's had a discussion with Allejandro about doing a dual credit student orientation. One of the local high schools didn't order books for them, so they didn't get books until well into the semester. The high schools don't realize that when students drop classes late, it's a "withdraw" which stays on their transcripts forever. Billie asked what others are doing to support dual credit students. Gene also has students who haven't logged on yet. His biggest issue is

poor internet access. Billie said Robertson High School students are not allowed to access Luna.edu emails on their Chromebooks. Billie would like for Allejandro to put together a group of faculty who could do an orientation for dual credit students. She's grateful to have an interim director. Their schedules for Spring and Summer are submitted.

5. Nichole Collins (STEM/Assessment Senator) – Geno is working on entering their

courses for Spring and Summer. They're all just trying to get HLC stuff completed. Nichole has an ITDE meeting scheduled for 8:00 a.m. on the 10th of October. She will get you the link if you are interested. Curriculum Committee needs to meet again probably the week after next.

- B. Standing Committee Reports

 How did Coffee Connects go? Mari Hill reported that it was Gene, Nichole, herself in attendance, and that Kevin showed up toward the end. The discussion was mostly about early childhood education and what New Mexico is doing with that. They also discussed some not so cool things about the state of education in the state and nation. There will be another virtual Coffee Connects in October. She will put out an email the week before, the week of, and the day of the Coffee Connects. It will again be the hour before the Faculty Senate meets. Nichole Collins mentioned that the Thanksgiving Luncheon with students and faculty will be scheduled during the week when the HLC is on campus so that they can intermingle with students. We need to confirm the dates
