Campus readies for fall

Classes start Aug. 17

As mid-August approached, employees at Luna Community College found themselves working toward the return of students for the Fall 2020 semester.

Making returning and prospective students aware of altered registration and course delivery procedures and reaching out to the communities has been a major occupation for many. The efforts have ranged from use of traditional and social media advertising, banners and distribution of course schedules to networking by admissions and recruitment staff and

others. Supplementing these has been implementation of a call center staffed by various Luna employees. (See inside for details.)

Participating remotely, employees have engaged in the typical week of in-service that traditionally prefaces the start of the school year. They undertook a host of trainings — enriching knowledge on such areas as FERPA laws, active shooter preparedness, harassment in the workplace, and Parliamentary procedure, as well as learning how to best engage and teach students via distance education technology.

While most classes that are traditionally part of the schedule will

return for Fall 2020, some — such as the popular physical education activity courses offered through the Gerald Ortega Wellness Center — have been shelved due to ongoing precautionary measures. Others, which typically involve hands-on training and teaching, are being handled in creative but careful new ways, keeping health and safety at the forefront.

Luna is also looking to solidify its popular dual credit program, enabling high schoolers to take classes and work toward degrees.

Registration continues through Monday, Aug. 24, with classes starting on Monday, Aug. 17.

Help line offered to students

Assistance provided for fall registration

Luna Community College has established a help line for students during the last few weeks of fall registration.

Students can now call Luna IT employee Larry Paiz at 505-454-5361 or 505-429-2545 for assistance at any time through the end of fall registration (Aug. 24).

"It is a great opportunity for students, and I am so glad I will be able to help," said Paiz. "I ask that when students call and if I'm on the line with another student, to please leave me a voice or text message. I will call them back as soon as I can."

Fall classes will begin on Monday, Aug. 17. Registration for fall 2020 will continue through the end of the business day Monday, Aug. 24.

With COVID-19 precautions, all registration continues to be conducted virtually.

Students are asked to view Luna's website at luna.edu and click on the "How to register for Fall 2020" link where there are step-bystep instructions on the registration process along with phone numbers and e-mail addresses of several departments students may contact. procedure.

"This is just another added benefit, a safety net, to help students," said Paiz.



Students are urged to leave a call back number; Luna team members will respond to those messages.

Students should call Paiz after they have exhausted the recommended registration Taking a page out of the old Labor Day telethons featuring comic actor Jerry Lewis, Luna employees recently teamed up to work the phone lines and promote fall registration.

up in the Technologies
Building Aug. 6, 7, 10 and
11. Employees volunteered
to call recent students,
encouraging them to enroll
for Fall 2020 and offering

from most years' due to the
COVID-19 pandemic.

The call center employed social distancing protocols to help ensure safety for the callers.

Apodaca reported that more than 1,400 calls were made, yielding approximately 230 successful registrations.

Additionally, hundreds were made aware that the college is planning for a vibrant fall semester with the help of remote delivery.

Census due Sept. 30

Deadline moved up a month; all citizens urged to participate

The deadline to participate in the 2020 U.S. Census has been changed to Sept. 30 — a full month earlier than had been previously set by the U.S. Census Bureau.

Every single person deserves to be counted. It's in the Constitution. If there ever was a time to come together in support of everyone in New Mexico — it is now. New Mexico stands to lose billions of dollars over the next decade if there is not a complete count.

We are asking you to continue your great work, dig deep, and join us in the final surge over the next 54 days.

We have one overarching message: Your chance to be counted is running out. Complete your Census today! Do it online, over the phone, or by mail.

You deserve to be counted. New Mexico deserves to be counted. Please do your part.

Help NM Get Counted!

Every person in New Mexico needs to be counted in the 2020 Census by September 30th. Will you help make sure everyone in your network is counted?

What can you do?

- Text this to your friends, family, and neighbors:
 - Hey! Did you do your census? I found out we only have until September 30th. I took mine online at 2020census.gov. Can you send this to some of your friends too?
- Post one of these on your social media.
- Follow iCountNM and share our posts with your network.
- Write a letter to the editor of your local newspaper.
- Reach out to your local complete count committee (<u>every county has one!</u>)
 and ask how you can help.

What can your organization do?

- Share information with your colleagues and employees via email or <u>hang a</u> poster in a common area.
- Schedule a day next week when your team/employees all commit to completing their census.
- Mention the census during calls or meetings with partners or clients.
- Include a census signature line on all emails.
 - 10 minutes today for a better tomorrow. Complete your census online, over the phone, or by mail. Respond by September 30th at 2020census.gov or 1-844-330-2020.

What should you say?

- You deserve to be counted in the 2020 Census.
- Your time to respond is running out so make sure you do it today.
- The Constitution guarantees your right to be counted.
- The stakes have never been higher for New Mexico. We're at risk of an undercount and if that happens, then we all lose out.
- It's better to get it out of the way now so that a Census taker doesn't have to follow up with you. That way you can avoid any interaction and they can spend their time with households that need the one-on-one help.
- By not participating, you're leaving money on the table for [insert county/city]. Money for schools, money for health care, money for essential programs.

Fall 2020 classes begin Monday, Aug. 17. Registration for Fall 2020 is open from Monday, July 6, to Monday, Aug. 24. Due to campus access restrictions, all registration and registration-related business will be handled remotely.

If you are a first-year student at Luna, you must first contact the admissions office via telephone or e-mail. After this, you will have to contact the Student Success Center, also via telephone or e-mail, for registration and the ACCUPLACER. Telephone numbers are listed below.
