Luna Community College's Inaugural AI Challenge: Innovation Unleashed!

Luna Community College recently concluded its first-ever AI Challenge, a unique opportunity for participants to explore the power of artificial intelligence and Google Gemini. The challenge posed a simple yet impactful question: "What is one way we can improve what we do and how we do it here at Luna Community College?"

Participants were encouraged to think creatively, addressing any aspect of LCC, from academic programs and facility enhancements to community outreach and technological advancements. The key to a winning submission was the ability to craft compelling prompts for Gemini, effectively "prompt engineering" to generate innovative and persuasive solutions. Entrants were required to document their prompts and Gemini's responses, showcasing the process of AI-assisted ideation.

The contest, held from February 3rd to 14th, saw a wave of insightful submissions. Judging focused on the originality and practicality of the proposed improvements.

We are thrilled to announce the winners:

- **1st Place:** Sherry Goodyear, whose innovative idea earned her 5 Luna Eats lunch tickets and an LCC Baseball Cap! Her question was "Gemini, what are some unusual out-side-of-the-typical-educational-box ideas that could be used to expand enrollment and graduation rates for Luna Community College in Las Vegas NM which has one main campus, two satellite campuses in Springer and Santa Rosa, and a site in Mora, NM."
- **2nd Place:** Karen Torres, awarded 3 Luna Eats lunch tickets for her valuable contribution. Her prompt was: "Increase staff morale in student services, and I kept asking AI to "do better" so that it offered several layers of ideas."
- **3rd Place:** Gloria Ortiz, who received 1 Luna Eats lunch ticket for her proposal which was: "How can LCC improve employee morale?"

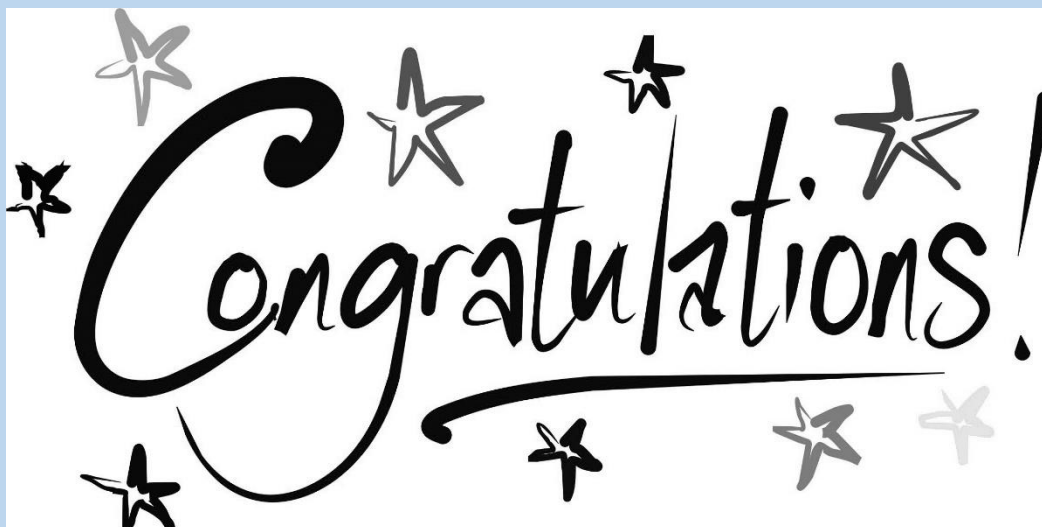

The ability to hike in and out of remote job sites and carry equipment and supplies is required.

Scholarship Guidelines & Process

Who We Are: The Luna Community College Foundation is a private 501(c)(3) organization formed for the purpose of assisting Luna Community College (LCC) in performing its mission of providing training and education for careers in technical and vocational fields for post-secondary students. That assistance may be accomplished in a variety of ways including support programs, financial assistance to students, financial assistance for LCC programs, physical plant enhancement, assistance in continuing educational opportunities for LCC administrative and instructional staff and the establishment and implementation of programs corollary to LCC instructional programs which augment and enhance the educational opportunities of LCC students.

The Luna Community College Foundation generates funding from private donors, fundraising activities, corporate grants, & employee contributions.

Who Is Eligible: Any student, in good academic standing (GPA 2.0+) who is actively enrolled at LCC (main campus or satellites) either on a part-time or full-time basis in any program affiliated with the college.

Financial Need: Financial need is the general requirement for all LCC Foundation Scholarships. Priority will be placed with student applicants who have a financial hardship that may prevent a student from attending or continuing an educational endeavor at LCC, this includes the inability of a student to purchase textbooks, supplies or other curriculum requirements essential for the courses for which they are enrolled.

Application Process: One application per student, per semester is allowed. This application must be submitted together with a copy of the students' current transcript and completed essay questions prior to the deadlines outlined herein.

Limitations: The LCC Foundation Scholarships cannot be awarded in arrears to pay for previous semester costs. Unless otherwise indicated, scholarships are limited to cost of attendance as listed on the LCC Award Letter.

Please submit your completed application with the required documentation to the Luna Community College Foundation office, located on the 2nd floor of the Student Services building, or submit by email to: lccfoundation@luna.edu

The LCC Foundation Scholarship Coordinator will present all applicants' required documentation to the Foundation Scholarship Committee for review, discussion, and final action. Once finalized, applicants will be notified by the LCC Foundation Scholarship Coordinator as to status and outcome of this application.

Scholarship Disbursement: Once a scholarship has been approved, the Foundation Scholarship Coordinator will initiate the process to fund the student's account at LCC with the award monies.

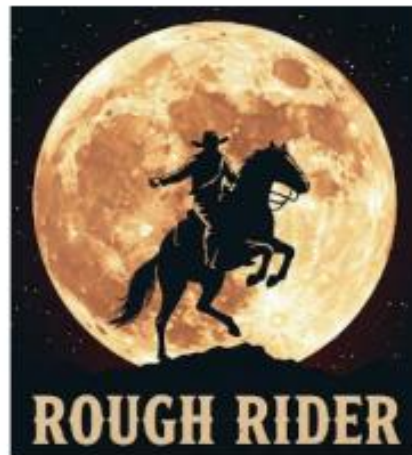

Good Morning LCC Students,

Are you ready to graduate in Fall or Spring? If so then this message is for you! It is time to begin gearing up for the biggest celebration of your academic career. Students who plan to finish degree or certificate requirements need to apply to graduate. How do you do this? Follow these steps and submit the attached to the Office of the Registrar by the deadline indicated below:

- All FALL graduates are eligible to walk in the SP25 commencement ceremony.
- Deadline to order your regalia (cap and gown) - Friday, March 28, 2025 with the LCC Bookstore - see attached flier for details
- **Deadline to apply to graduate SPRING GRADUATES ONLY - Monday, March 10, 2025 by 5pm MST- submit Application for Degree and pay the one-time graduation fee of \$15.00 per degree or certificate. (attached)**

ALL STUDENTS PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO INDICATE ON YOUR APPLICATION FOR DEGREE YES OR NO, IF YOU WILL BE WALKING FOR THE SPRING 2025 COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY.

Students will receive their Final Degree Check clearing them for their degree via your LCC Student Email to include your eligibility for graduation honors. All students who are eligible for honors will be able to purchase the honor cord with your regalia order at the Bookstore who will have a list of students who qualify.

Students need to meet with their academic advisors to have their Application for Degree signed before submission to the Office of the Registrar. Also, students are required to pay the one-time non-refundable \$15 graduation fee (per award) at the time they submit their Graduation Clearance form. Failure to submit your Graduation Application and pay your fee will result in a delay of you receiving your diploma.

If you have already submitted your documents to our office please be on the lookout for your clearance via your LCC student email. If students feel that they need to be seen for a Final Degree by the Registrar's Office, please contact us to schedule your appointment.
