EMT-Basic Certificate Enrollment Process

- **STEP 1** Contact Allied Health personnel to schedule appointment by phone or in person to begin the process. We are located in the Allied Health building on the Luna campus

- **STEP 2** Get admitted to Luna Community College (https://luna.edu/admissions).
 - Apply by paper or online at https://luna.edu/application
 - You will get a username, email address, and Student ID number

STEP 3 Seek financial assistance.

- The EMT-Basic program does not qualify for federal financial aid. However, Luna's EMT-Basic program is approved by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), which can provide you with funding. Please go to the Workforce Development Office on Grand by Dairy Queen to sign up. Students must sign up for WIOA funding prior to the course start date.

STEP 4 Register for the following courses (12 cr).

- EMT 150 (8 cr) Emergency Medical Tech-Basic
- EMT150L (3 cr) Emergency Medical Tech-Basic Lab
- You will also need one or two extra Saturdays
- EMT180 (1 cr) Emergency Med Tech Field/Clinic Sec 01 TBA completed at end of course.
- **Important Note:** this course will be taught in conjunction with an IET instructor who will be responsible for providing all students with academic support. There may be additional time required outside of the traditional class time for students needing extra support.
- **STEP 4** Pay the following fees at the Luna Business Office in the Maria Paiz Administration Building. We will give you a form to accompany your payment.
 - \$210 Enrollment fee (LCC Business Office)
 - \$66 Malpractice Insurance (LCC Business Office)
 - The two above fees: \$276.00
 - \$75 payment is required to remain registered. (Holding Fee- counts toward your tuition, and is your initial fee.)

STEP 6 Arrange to pay your tuition and fees.

- o \$150 Luna course and registration fee

OTHER REQUIREMENTS



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- This course is being taught with an Integrated Education and Training (IET) design incorporating Adult Education & Literacy, Workforce Preparation, and Workforce training. As such there will be additional pre- and post-assessment of skills and we will be using a co-teaching model with an IET instructor in the classroom. You will be contacted by a career navigator to do a needs assessment.
