




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Overview of Publication





Five Year Trend



Degree Seeking vs. Non-Degree




Full-Time vs. Part-Time





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Academic Year Totals




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End-of-Term Enrollment

Four Year Enrollment Trend












Degrees/Certificates Conferred

Five Year Totals by Academic Program






