Please note there are fees for these classes, and that if you are a private citizen or with a Fire or Emergency Response Agency that is not prepared to cover the course fees, that **there's easy Financial Aid for anyone needing it. June Classes:

S215 Fire Operations in the Wildland Urban Interface

June 17th and 18th, 2-day class
Fee: \$260/Student
Time: 0800-1700 each day

First-Aid/CPR/AED

June 20th
0900-1500
Fee \$60/student

This class, once completed, will provide students with the AHA valid certification card (good for two years). This is an essential class not only for firefighters and emergency responders, but truly an essential for every civilian. It will afford everyone essential lifesaving skills related to all circumstances (including the skills essential for life-saving related to children AND infants)

July Classes:

Community Wildfire Protection *community-oriented training (see *note above)

July 12th, 4hour class
Fee: \$65.00/Student
Evening class--1730-2130 (5:30pm to 9:30pm)

*Note: this is a **community-oriented training** that's focused on home and surrounding area, protection teaching how to better prepare homes, surrounding land and communities, in general—how to be better protected against potential wildfire threats.

Structural Ignition in Wildfires *community-oriented class (see *note above)

July 13th and 14th (2-day class)
Fee: \$260/student
Time: 0800-1700

NOTE: this class is **community oriented**, as well as **Wildland Firefighter** training, and focuses on what causes homes and buildings to ignite, when wildfires are close at hand. This particular class is a "step up" from the firefighter's Wildland-Urban Interface training, as it deals in more depth with the science and known causes of structural ignition. It also will address "triage" that's essential when wildfire threats are imminent, but it will be an essential class for anyone wanting to understand why buildings catch fire (despite the actual threatening fireline not being close to homes and buildings).

Fee: \$60/student

S212 Wildland Fire Chainsaws (Sawyers)

July 13th, 14th, 20th and 21st, 4-day class (Fri, Sat, Fri, Sat)
Fee: \$520/student
Time: 0800-1700 each day

-S211 Portable Pumps

July 25th, 26th & 27th, 3-day class
Fee: \$390/student
Time: 0800-1700 each day
