# City officials speak on water crisis during forum at Luna

Las Vegas Mayor
Louie Trujillo along with
Utilities Director Maria
Gilvarri and City Manager
Leo Maestas said that
there is about 23 days of
water left in the City's
reservoir during a forum
Thursday at Luna
Community College.

About 40 people attended the forum which was held at the Media Education Auditorium.

Ash-laden runoff from recent wildfires caused the City of Las Vegas to declare a state of emergency in July.

Trujillo emphasized that the City is doing everything they can to make sure Las Vegas does not run out of

drinking water. Trujillo said that "every idea is on the table."

A temporary filtration system is being installed at Storrie Lake which should be ready for testing very soon.

During the forum, City officials said that they are working with state and federal partners on the water crisis issue and that replacing the entire treatment

center in Montezuma is part of a long-term solution.

"We are working 24seven," said Trujillo.

Trujillo said that drinking water is provided to Las Vegas residents every Wednesday at the Abe Montoya Recreation Center. Trujillo said they gave water to 2,300 households the first week and to 2,700 this past Wednesday.

Some ideas on conservation are low flow toilets and the use of drinking out of water bottles. Luna will start providing bottled water next week to its students and employees

The City of Las Vegas uses about 1.5 million

gallons a day.

For more information on the City's water situation, Trujillo recommends citizens view the City's website, Facebook page as well as reading the Las Vegas Optic. Trujillo also said individuals can call City offices as well. Trujillo thanked every citizen for doing their best to conserve water.

During the Boot Camp members of the Student Nurses Association (SNA) provided snacks and recruited incoming students to become SNA members.


On Monday, August 15 the nursing department conducted orientation for all new and returning nursing students.
