

AAUW "Girls Can" Event Inspires 5th Graders at Luna

On Tuesday, April 22, Luna Community College proudly hosted the fourth annual "Girls Can!" event in partnership with the Las Vegas branch of the American Association of University Women (AAUW). Montañas del Norte Area Health Education Center under the direction of Raymond Sanchez provided grant support. This inspiring program invites fifth-grade girls from across the region to spend a day on campus, engaging in hands-on activities and exploring career paths they may not have considered—particularly in fields where women remain underrepresented.

This year, 137 students, along with their teachers and staff, attended from Mike Mateo Sena, Sierra Vista, Union, Mora/Holman, Pecos, Anton Chico, Santa Rosa, and Springer elementary schools, as well as local homeschool students. The event offered these young learners a unique opportunity to experience a college setting and begin to imagine themselves as future college students.

Workshops throughout the day were led by dedicated Luna faculty and staff, whose creativity and mentorship brought the experience to life. These included Rachael Lucero (DNA), Briana Montaño Baca (AI), Germaine Sandoval, Clarice Bonney and students (cosmetology), Gene Martinez (welding), Lisa Bentson, Devon Chisholm, Kraig Bellows, & Jessica Garcia Montoya (flight simulation), Crystal Western Ford (Community Needs), Amber Elliott & Valerie Montoya (nursing), and Denise Fox with help from Raylynn Griffith (dental assisting). Their energy and enthusiasm made a lasting impression on the students.

The success of the event was made possible by the many staff who supported logistics and coordination, including Mary Frances Bibb, April Sandoval, Matt Griego, Francisco Melendez, and others who helped throughout the day.

In addition to Luna's team, we are grateful to our community partners who offered unique sessions—Lucy Finch (art), Renee Hernandez (flowers, wildlife, and the environment), Carol Litherland (sign language), Cheri Burch (measurements), and Carolyn Hartwell (insects)—broadening the students' perspectives on careers and interests. The event was organized by AAUW members Mary Shaw, Mary Byers, Carla Romero, Phyllis Ludi, and Karyl Lyne; many community members volunteered as group guides.

Although schools from Wagon Mound, Vaughn, Valley, and Rio Gallinas were unable to attend this year, we look forward to including them in future events and continuing to strengthen our regional partnerships.

"Girls Can!" remains a powerful example of Luna's and AAUW's commitment to educational access and opportunity for young women throughout Northern New Mexico. We are deeply thankful to the Las Vegas community members who helped create another inspiring day of exploration, learning, and possibility.





Wildfire Season Preparedness

From the Wildfire Resiliency Training Center

This spring and summer are shaping up to be potentially very active. Dry, warm winter coupled with unusually high spring winds and temperatures as well as low relative humidity all point toward a possible active wildfire season.

There are dozens upon dozens of websites and agency recommendations. Which ones should we follow? Which ones might we question. Here at the WRTC, our recommendations are based upon years of scientific research including laboratory analyses, actual live burn research in the field, hundreds and hundreds of post-fire investigations and measurements, and interviews with homeowners and evacuees.

This research has shown how wildfire behaves, especially in relationship to homes, structures, topography, vegetation and weather. Here are some tips and information to help with your wildfire preparedness:

- Most homes/structures are ignited by embers, not large flames. Harden your home against ember "attack" by covering/screening vents and roof openings, move flammable debris such as leaves and pine needles from wooden decks and stairs. Trim or rake dry/dead vegetation near the structures. This creates a "survivable" space for your home.
- Prepare an evacuation plan. Have items such as documents, medicines, and keepsakes ready to put in your vehicle quickly. Have the same plan for your pets as well!
- When you're preparing to evacuate, close windows, doors garages. Don't worry about removing window treatments or moving furniture away from walls...you don't need to do this.
- Most civilian injuries and accidents in wildfire occur during evacuation. Prepare and leave early. Once in a safe area, then contact family and friends.
- Again, by following these guidelines, you are creating a "survivable" space (one
 in which your home has a better likelihood of surviving on its own. Creating a
 "defensible" space infers that responders will move into the path of the fire and
 defend your home. This is highly unlikely due to life safety and limited resources
 in active wildfire.
- Preparedness includes some common yard work, cleaning gutters, preventing ember entry and being ready to evacuate promptly.

On the day of your exam, please arrive 10 minutes early* to log in and purchase the exam. The cost of the exam is \$70. You will need to bring a debit/credit card to purchase the exam and a photo ID for identification verification. No food or drinks are permitted in the testing site. A calculator is available in ATI and the proctor will provide paper and pencils for use during the exam. All materials will be collected by the proctor before you leave the exam site.
